
## MATERIAL FLOW DIAGRAM

\* Construction and Demolition (C&D) waste is not MSW (e.g. should not be included in the Recycling Rate calculation. However, County scale records do not positively discern C&D burned at the RRF from MSW burned at the RRF. Therefore, the calculations above are conservative (e.g. lower bounded) in that they assume that all tons burned are MSW, eligible for recycling, and included in denominator. However, scale records do enable a reasoned estimate of C&D burned at the RRF to 45,344 tons. Removing the C&D burned the RRF from stream 7, reduces the calculation of stream 1 (backyard composting) to 7,400 tons, and yields the following rates:

- \*\* Nonprocessibles are Construction & Demolition-type materials: not eligible for recycling credit, but are County-managed solid waste.
- \*\*\* For State and EPA methods, numerator and denominator exclude motor oil

"C&D" means "Construction and Demolition" waste, exclusive of MSW, traditionally managed by the private sector, but much now comes to County TS. "CMW" means "County Management Waste". It includes all MSW, whether or not exported by private sector collectors, but only C&D delivered to TS.

Nomenclature:

"MSW" stands for "Municipal Solid Waste", and represents the waste eligible for recycling under the State recycling law, regulations and guidelines. "TS" stands for the County's "Transfer Station", located in Derwood, Maryland, just south of Gaithersburg.
