#### **Backyard Composting**

As part of Earth Month (April 2018), the Division of Solid Waste Services (DSWS) offered a "How to Backyard Compost" recycling volunteer training session for volunteers who were interested in learning more about backyard composting. Several recycling volunteers attended and received step-by-step training and a manual to help them teach others how to start and maintain their own backyard compost bin, as well as how to use this nutrient rich soil amendment for their lawn and gardens. The training proved to be most helpful as many of the volunteers who attended the training also joined DSWS staff the following day at Meadowside Nature Center to assist with a Backyard Composting Demonstration event. Longtime recycling volunteer Ken Lavish conducted a hands-on demonstration about the do's and don'ts of backyard composting while fellow recycling volunteers provided information and distributed compost bins to County residents.



#### **Community Shred/Recycling**



If you haven't had a chance to volunteer this year, don't worry. We have many volunteer opportunities available for you such as the next Community Paper Shredding and Recycling event. Join DSWS staff and the NBC4 team on June 23<sup>rd</sup> for the Division's busiest confidential paper shredding/recycling event of the year. The event will be held at the Montgomery College Rockville Campus in Parking Lot 13 and will run from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Last year, 33 volunteers helped process 2,309 cars and collected 99,035 lbs. (49.5 tons) of paper for shredding and 4,120 lbs. (2.06 tons) of cardboard for recycling. Overall, a total



of 52 tons of paper and cardboard were recycled! Volunteers are needed from 7:15 a.m. to 12 noon to help set-up, distribute recycling information, direct traffic, unload boxes from cars, break down cardboard boxes and help with clean-up.

#### 2018 Agricultural Fair

### It's that time of the year!

The 2018 Montgomery County Agricultural Fair begins Friday, August 10th and runs through Saturday, August 18, 2018.



This year, during the 9-day fair, we will be highlighting what residents can do at home and in their backyard to ensure cleaner land, air

and water for everyone. Last year, DSWS staff teamed up with 79 recycling volunteers who contributed 458 hours of their time providing recycling education to 8,709 people who visited our fun interactive exhibits and craft activity table.



Each day will have four, 3-hour shifts: (9am-12noon, 12noon-3pm, 3pm-6pm and 6pm-9pm). Volunteers can sign up for one or multiple shifts during the 9-day fair. Once you have registered, all volunteers must attend a Pre-Fair orientation to help you prepare for your shift(s).

#### **Back to Recycling Basics**

Montgomery County has a dual stream recycling program meaning that residents, who receive County-provided recycling services have two blue recycling containers, one blue bin for commingled



materials such as bottles, cans and containers and a blue wheeled cart for mixed paper and cardboard. Commingled items and mixed paper are kept separate during the point of collection, transportation and processing at the Montgomery County Shady Grove Processing Facility and Transfer Station. Having a dual stream recycling program lowers the level of contamination which, provides higher quality material and sale value.

To see how your commingled materials and mixed paper are processed, visit the County's Recycling Center located at 16105 Frederick Road in Derwood. Self-guided tours are offered on the

following days: Monday and Tuesday from 6:00 a.m. -3:30 p.m., Wednesday and Thursday from 6:00 a.m. -2:30 p.m., and Friday from 6:00 a.m. -12:30 p.m. Guided tours are also available for individuals and groups of 10 or more and can be scheduled online by visiting our website at: montgomerycountymd.gov/sws/facilities/rc/.

The County does not provide refuse or recycling collection services to independent municipalities such as the City of Gaithersburg, City of Takoma Park, and the City of Rockville, to name a few. #### Reduce The Risk For Trash Fires

Fires can occur in piles of trash as trash is collected in trash trucks, and when trash is delivered to the Transfer Station or the Resource Recovery Facility for processing. Please keep the following materials or items out of the trash:

- Hazardous materials
- Chemicals
- Gasoline and other flammable liquids
- Oil-based paints
- Rechargeable batteries
- Ashes from fireplaces or fire pits
