KNOW THE SIGNS:

- Are you unable to get the person's attention?
- Is the person vomiting uncontrollably?
- Is the person having a seizure?
- Does the person seem confused?
- Does the person seem cold or clammy?
- Is the skin pale or bluish in color?
- Is the person breathing slowly (less than 6 breaths every minute)?
- Is the person breathing irregularly with at least ten seconds between breath?

When left untreated: Risks include hypothermia, hypoglycemia, dehydration seizures, permanent injury and death.
