


# BRT in Montgomery County

# Bringing **BRT** (Bus Rapid Transit) to Montgomery County

## Why BRT?

Montgomery County's proposed BRT routes will add a new transit option that is crucial to the county's economic development, job creation and the future mobility of residents.

## What makes BRT different?

BRT is an affordable way to speed travel times; it provides fast, frequent, convenient service. BRT operates like a light rail system with more flexibility, often in dedicated lanes, but costs far less. BRT passengers ride comfortably - enjoying stations with upgraded amenities such as real time information displays, wifi, ticket vending machines, and level boarding.


## Who else has BRT?

A local example is Metroway in Alexandria, Virginia. BRT service can be found across the country and throughout the world. Examples include Boston's Silver Line, Cleveland's Health Line, Los Angeles' Metro Rapid service, Eugene's EmX, Albany's BusPlus, and Aspen's Veloci.

## What routes are being studied?

Montgomery County is working with the State of Maryland to study possible BRT routes, including:

- **MD 355 from Clarksburg to Bethesda**
- **US 29 from Burtonsville to Silver Spring**
- **MD 586 (Veirs Mill Rd) from Rockville to Wheaton**
- **Corridor Cities Transitway (CCT) Phase 1** from Shady Grove to Metropolitan Grove
