Introduction: Expedited Bill 18-14, Secondhand Personal Property - Automated

Purchasing Machines

Expedited Bill 18-14, Secondhand Personal Property – Automated Purchasing Machines, sponsored by Council President Rice and Councilmembers Branson, Floreen, and Riemer, is scheduled to be introduced on March 18, 2014. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for April 8 at 1:30 p.m.

Bill 18-14 would amend the County's secondhand personal property law to prohibit the use of automated purchasing machines (also known as "reverse vending machines") in the County.

Background

An automated purchasing machine (APM) is a self-service kiosk that dispenses payment, typically in cash, for cell phones or other electronic devices. Such transactions are currently covered under the County's Secondhand Personal Property law, Chapter 44A of the Code, but the existing law does not directly address the use of APMs. Baltimore City and Baltimore County have recently enacted local laws prohibiting the use of APMs¹ out of concern that APMs provide a convenient opportunity for cell phone thieves to convert stolen goods to cash without human interaction, thereby encouraging such thefts. There are currently four bills being considered by the Maryland General Assembly to regulate and license the use of APMs in Maryland.
