SUBJECT: **Introduction:** Bill 21-17, Animal Control – Municipal Dog Exercise Area

Bill 21-17, Animal Control – Municipal Dog Exercise Area, sponsored by Lead Sponsor Councilmember Katz and Co-Sponsors Council President Berliner and Councilmembers Rice and Elrich, is scheduled to be introduced on June 20, 2017. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for July 11 at 1:30 p.m.

Bill 21-17 would allow a dog to be off leash if it is in an area that a municipality has identified as a dog exercise area and amend the definition of at-large animals.

- (2) amend the definition of at-large animals; and
- (3) generally amend the County's animal control law.

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland approves the following Act:

Sec. 1. Section 5-101 is amended as follows:

5-101. Definitions.

In this Chapter, the following words and phrases have the following meanings:

At large: A dog, except a service animal, is at large if it is outside the owner's premises and not leashed, unless it is in a dog exercise area designated by either the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, or a municipality, or is participating in a qualified activity. Any other animal is at large if it is outside the owner's premises and is not leashed or immediately responsive to verbal or non-verbal direction. For purposes of this Chapter or any other animal control law, the common area of a homeowners' association, condominium, or cooperative is not the owner's premises.

LEGISLATIVE REQUEST REPORT

Bill 21-17

Animal Control – Municipal Dog Exercise Area

DESCRIPTION: Bill 16-17 would allow a dog to be off leash if it is in an area that a municipality has identified as a dog exercise area.

PROBLEM: Under current law, a dog is considered “at large” if it is outside the owners premises and not leashed, unless it is in a dog exercise area designated by M-NCPPC. Municipalities may want to designate dog exercise areas within their jurisdictions.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: To allow a municipality to designate a dog exercise area.
