

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For FY16, the Council received 376 applications* totaling \$19.8 million in requests.

The grants advisory group reviewed 301 of these applications requesting total funding of \$15.6 million. As in the past, 15 applications submitted by Montgomery Cares members were evaluated by the Montgomery Cares Advisory Board and will be presented to the Council’s Health and Human Services (HHS) Committee. Additionally, because of an unexpectedly large increase in the number of applications received this year, three groups of grants usually reviewed by the Grants Advisory Group were instead evaluated by staff and discussed with the HHS Committee.

The table that follows provides information on number of applications received, the number of organizations submitting applications, the total dollar amount requested and the number of grants reviewed by the Grants Advisory Group since FY14.

Since FY14, the number of proposals submitted has increased by 53%, the number of organizations submitting applications by 34%, the total funds requested by 58% and the number reviewed by the Grants Advisory Group has increased by 36%.

Pages 7 to 41 of this document present a matrix identifying the 376 applications received. The matrix identifies those applications the County Executive recommended for funding as part of his recommended FY16 budget. Additionally a one-page evaluation for each Grants Advisory Group-reviewed application is included in Appendix I.

BACKGROUND

On October 28, 2014, the Montgomery County Council adopted Resolution #17-1252 which established an application and review process for funding requests from non-profit organizations for FY16. This resolution is attached as Appendix 1 (©A1-A3).

For FY16 the Council indicated that it “is particularly interested in proposals that provide emergency and other assistance to the neediest members of our community.” The FY16 Council Grant Application and supporting materials noted this Council priority.

For the first time this year, the County Council and the County Executive jointly adopted a new online system for grant submission and review. The application process opened on November 17, 2014. In December, county staff held two workshops for applicants introducing the new process and answering questions about the grants programs. The county accepted applications for both programs until January 13. A sample completed application is attached in Appendix 3 (©A4-A13).

As in past years, the Council appointed a Grants Advisory Group to review applications and provide evaluative comments on the proposals. This is the final report of the FY16 Grants Advisory Group to the Council, and completes the Group’s work.

Collectively, the Grants Advisory Group spent well over 500 hours in 58 different meetings discussing the process, reviewing applications and meeting with applicants. Three of the meetings were of the full Grants Advisory Group and 55 were in smaller teams of 3 members (eleven small teams each held five meetings). Further, each of the 37 members of the Group spent approximately 25 hours independently reading applications and drafting evaluations for a total of more than 900 additional hours. In sum, the community panel dedicated over 1,400 hours to reviewing the applications received.

For the grants submitted to the Council, each small team reviewed approximately 23 similar applications. Between February 24 and April 7, each grant applicant was invited to attend a brief Question and Answer session with the Grants Advisory Group team reviewing their application. Almost all applicants accepted this invitation. In addition, a separate team reviewed 48 County Executive-recommended Community Grants that were not previously submitted to the Council. Because of the constrained time frame for review of these Executive-recommended grants, the Grants Advisory Group was not able to have Q&A sessions with these applicants.

Applications have been identified according to the following categories: large capital: \$50,000 or greater; small capital: less than \$50,000; and operating support for *established* organizations incorporated prior to or in 2007 or *newer* organizations, established after year 2007.

Applications have also been identified according to program area as directed by the Council:

- Basic needs/Emergency services/ Housing-related services/ Legal services;
- Community Development;
- Economic Development and Workforce Development;
- Health and Behavioral Health;
- Services to Children and Families;
- Services to Older Adults and People with Disabilities;
- Youth Development;
- Other

The “Other” category refers to applications that did not fall into one of the identified program areas. This year, it included proposals for conflict resolution, agriculture, cultural activities, language translation, nonprofit capacity building, security, animal welfare and the environment.

SUMMARY INFORMATION

The table below identifies the number of applications and the total amount of requested funding in each program area. This table is inclusive of all grants requests received.

As indicated above, this Report of the Grants Advisory Group includes information for both Council grant requests and for County Executive-recommended grants. Each is summarized below.

1. **Council grant applications.** For FY16, the Council accepted 312 applications (one application was subsequently withdrawn). This compared to 234 in FY15 and 188 in FY14 and is a **66% increase in requests over the two year period.**

Applications reviewed by the Grants Advisory Group. The Grants Advisory Group reviewed and evaluated 253 of the Council Grant applications. A summary spreadsheet identifying each of these requests begins on page 7.

Many applications were submitted to both the County Council and the County Executive and those recommended for full funding by the Executive are noted in **bold**; those recommended for partial funding are identified in *italics* with the amount recommended by the Executive in the CE column. An asterisk beside the name of the organization denotes an application submitted to the Council that was a duplicate of an application to the Community Development Block Grant program, a County government competitive grant program.

Staff-evaluated applications discussed by Council Committee. As noted above, this year 44 Council applications were evaluated by Council staff and discussed with the Health and Human Services Committee. These applications were for emergency assistance programs, food programs, and large capital expenditures (\$50,000 or over). They are listed beginning on page 32.

Montgomery Cares Applications. As in past years, the Montgomery Cares Advisory Board reviewed Grant Applications submitted by Montgomery Cares member organizations. These applications, which will be discussed at an upcoming HHS Committee worksession are listed on pages 40-41.

2. **Executive-recommended Community Grants.** The Executive recommended a total of 168 discretionary Community Grants (compared to 151 in FY15) in the Community Grants Non-Departmental Account, plus 12 more that are contained in the capital budget. (These figures do not include Arts and Humanities Grants.) Additionally, The Executive recommended full or partial funding for four Council applications through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. For a complete listing of all Executive-recommended discretionary Community Grants, and Community Development Block Grants, see *Appendix 4* ©A15-21.

Applications reviewed by Grants Advisory Group. Sixty-five of the County Executive-recommended grants had not been previously submitted to the Council, and the Grants Advisory Group reviewed 48 of them. The summary spreadsheet for these 48 begins on page 28.

Staff-evaluated applications discussed by Council Committee. Staff recommendations for the remaining 17 County Executive-recommended grants that had not been previously submitted to the Council were discussed by Council Committee and are listed on pages 28-31 of this report. As with Council Grants, these

applications were for emergency assistance programs, food programs, and large capital expenditures.

EVALUATIVE COMMENTS

Each of the 376 grant applications received by the Council has been carefully reviewed and evaluated. Information about those evaluations is described below:

Grants Advisory Group-reviewed applications. The Grants Advisory Group compiled one-page summaries of evaluative comments for each application reviewed. The summaries are attached on ©1-©299. As directed by the Council, the report of the Grants Advisory Group does not rank, score, or tier the applications.

Several of the County Executive-recommended Community Grants are for additional or different funding elements of the same program reviewed in a Council grant application, or for general operating support for an organization that submitted a Council grant application. In those cases, the evaluation form references the more detailed comments for the Council grant application.

Staff-evaluated applications. Council staff reviewed each of these applications and supporting documentation, and when necessary contacted applicants for additional information. Further, the Montgomery Cares Advisory Board reviewed many of the public health applications. Staff then prepared memoranda for discussion at Committee meetings. All applications were evaluated using the following criteria established by the Council:

**Fiscal Year 2016 Montgomery County Council Grant Application
Evaluation Criteria and Supporting Questions**

Cost-benefit analysis

- a. What is the cost of the service or activity and number of recipients?
- b. What is the impact on the recipient relative to the cost?

Public benefit

- a. Is the need clearly identified and demonstrated?
- b. Is the target population clearly described and well served by this proposal?
- c. Is there justification for the program?

Strength of organization

- a. How long have these services been delivered by this agency and for how long has this program received public funds?
- b. What efforts have been made to recruit/utilize volunteers in the program and/or leverage community resources?
- c. What other partner organizations is the applicant working with to address the needs of those served?
- d. Has the organization substantially leveraged other non-county government funding for the proposal or other programs? If the organization is asking for the majority of its funding through the County, has it provided a compelling rationale for its reliance on County funding? Does the organization's financial statement show a diversity of funding sources?
- e. Does the organization's financial statement indicate actual revenues and expenditures were in line with budgeted projections?
- f. Based on the budgetary information, does the organization have the capacity to carry out the proposed program?

Strength of proposal

- a. Does the proposal clearly describe what the project proposes to do and what recipients will get out of it?
- b. Does the proposal outline the anticipated outcomes of the program and are the outcomes measurable and relevant?
- c. If the proposal requests funds for an existing program, does it describe the results/outcomes achieved to date? Evaluate the results achieved to date.
- d. If the proposal requests funds for a new program, does it provide information on success of program in other jurisdictions, evidence of best practices, etc.?
- e. Are there specific plans for integration/coordination with other existing nonprofit organizations and County services?
- f. Does the proposal contain a sufficiently detailed program budget to be able to assess whether project budget is in line with proposed project?
- g. Does the proposal address plans for continuing support after the grant ends and the availability of other resources?
- h. Are there any major concerns with the budget?
