Planning efforts for the present and future of sewage systems, for the county.</li> <li>2. Onsite Systems and exceptions</li> <li>3. Special policies for water and sewage services; allows consideration of limited main extensions from existing abutting mains.</li> <li>Goal is for the council to have a policy and a plan,</li> </ul>	
	rather than an exception, which will ascertain that if the State approves the policy, the state won't deny the plan.  • Key Takeaways  1. All extensions if approved will be "one off." Further extensions won't be approved.  2. Committees' concern was that this might be like opening a Pandora's box.  3. Using public plan will be better for a consolidated plan for the county, and not as 'owners' or incidents decide.
