Update on the Design-Build-Maintain contract (Frank Dawson, Chief, Watershed Restoration Section) RFP from last year cancelled as it became clear that requirements of the permit were going to change Waiting on MDE permit language/requirements Guidance from MDE provided in early October All BMPs now provide credit for impervious (adding stream restoration, green infrastructure, flood control) Still need draft permit to push forward | | | |

- Pam asked about timeframe per Frank and Amy hopefully end of year, but still only draft, Frank noted they are still working on repairs, etc., but still can't issue RFP
- Crystal followed up asking about current work Frank noted some restoration occurring and DEP will bank some of that work for the next permit, will add some new projects if it drags out, but definitely losing time
- Drew asked about a reason for the delay at MDE (and the WIP)
 Frank wasn't sure, Kate noted that MDE is changing requirements Frank noted 4 metrics (Phosphorus, Nitrogen, TSS and IA) Amy said the WIP is affecting the timeline
- Question about Council (are they aware/troubled) they are aware, glad there are current projects moving along

 - Handout provided that outlines new positions
 - Focus on communication
 - Charts with new org on website
 - Question about metrics changing Patty noted there is a focus on improving efficiency (recycling numbers, etc.) but also customer satisfaction – queue at transfer station
 - Adam Ortiz's goals to be shared in "performance plan"
 - Solid Waste Master plan taking incinerator offline? How to improve recycling, need higher tech solutions, transfer station undersized (built for half of current population)
 - Also safety concerns at transfer station
- c. Preliminary Overview of WSSC Drinking Water Testing for EPA Unregulated Contaminants (Bob Buglass, Environmental Sciences Section Manager, WSSC)
 - WSSC required to test for unregulated contaminants driven by EPA per the Safe Drinking Water Act
 - Monitor for elements not yet regulated
 - Assessment every 5 year cycle goes back to 1980s
 - Some elements become regulated
 - All larger water providers required to do

 - Geared towards residents, watershed groups
