	 Montgomery County's NPDES MS4 Permit FY20 Annual Report and Financial Assurance Plan (FAP) by Kate Bennett, Senior Planning Specialist, DEP The Annual Report is a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit update The MS4 Permit is basically a water quality permit to limit pollutants in stormwater discharges or other unauthorized discharges from the MS4. The Annual Report provided updates on sections entitled: Stormwater Management, Erosion and Sediment Control, Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination, Trash and Litter, Property Management, Road Maintenance, Public Education, Watershed Assessment, Watershed Restoration, Assessment of Controls, Program Funding, and Total Maximum Daily Loads Tracy asked if DEP has seen a rise of excess salt incidents, e.g., fish kills; DEP not aware of a rise, but depends on amount of snow. Ken asked, given the 30,000 feet of streams restored, what was the square footage footprints of these projects, including access roads - we need this data to understand the true impact of stream restorations. Kate said they would work on providing that. 		
	 Presentation on Montgomery County's Financial Assurance Plan (FAP) by Kate Bennett, Senior Planning Specialist, DEP This is a biennial report to demonstrate that County has sufficient funding for the next 2 years of MS4 Permit projects. Ken asked about missing data for "the planned and programmed activities from FY21 through FY25." Kate said that the new package revision has that data. They use CIP budget to estimate future spending: FAP Public Hearing staff report: https://www.montgomerycountymd.gov/council/Resources/Files/agenda/col/2021/20210309/20210309_6.pdf Bay TMDL is not in current 2010 permit but will be in 2021 Permit along with local TMDLs. (b) Discussion on Montgomery County Climate Action Plan: led by Pam Rathbone Pam thought the WQAG's comments are well reflected in the CAP.
