Dear Resident:

The purpose of this letter is to update you on the Old Farm Creek Stream Restoration Project. In August of 2018, the Montgomery County Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) sent a letter informing you that the project had been placed on hold due to a lack of funding. Our department is pleased to announce that funding has now been secured, and the Old Farm Creek Stream Restoration Project is once again able to move forward.

The project area includes approximately 1,800 feet of a tributary to Old Farm Creek (see map on reverse side). Design work on the project is progressing and we anticipate construction to begin in the summer of 2021.

The DEP hosted several informational public meetings and community walks before the project was put on hold this past August. Now that the project is moving forward, DEP will hold a public meeting later this year to update residents about project completion and construction. Residents will be notified two weeks before this event.
