As a young man, Henry Shelton enlisted in the U.S. Army to serve his country in World War II. He was a member of Company "D" of the 537th Quartermaster Battalion which was stationed in England during WWII. After a honorable discharge from the Army, he moved with his wife, Jessie Mae, to Washington, DC. They had one daughter, Brenda L. Wolff. He started his career with the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA). One of his responsibilities with the GSA was to help move presidents in and out of the White House. He retired from the GSA with more than 30 years service. Shelton lived in Silver Spring, Maryland before he passed away on February 21, 2004.
