Army SP4 Robert William Abernathy, 20, of Rockville, Maryland. Abernathy was killed in action from multiple fragmentation wounds in Darlac, South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 173rd Airborne Brigade. Gave his life on March 4, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 42E, Line 59. Graduated from Robert E. Peary High School in 1965.



Air Force Capt George R. Andrews, 25, of Glen Echo Heights, Maryland. Andrews died while missing after his plane crashed in Kien Tuong Province, South Vietnam when he was protecting South Vietnamese river boats on his second tour of duty. His body was recovered. He was assigned to 615th Tactical Fighter Squadron, 35th Tactical Fighter Wing, 7th Air Force. Gave his life on October 15, 1969. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel W17, Line 80. Graduated from Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School in 1961 and from the University of Maryland in 1966 with a degree in engineering.



Army PFC John A. Ansell, Jr., 19, of Bethesda, Maryland. Ansell died while missing after a ground casualty in Thua Thien Province in South Vietnam. His body was recovered. He was assigned to A Company, 2nd Battalion, 327th Infantry, 101st Airborne Division. Gave his life on May 2, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 53E, Line 44. Attended Northwestern and Bladensburg High School. Awarded a Purple Heart posthumously.

Army SP4 Frederick Allen Barclay, 20, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Barclay was killed in action by small arms fire in Thua Thien, South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division. Gave his life on May 5, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 54E, Line 42. Graduated from Wheaton High School in 1966.



Army SGT Harold Edward Barnard, 29, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Barnard was in a defensive position near Black Horse Base in Long Khanh Province, when he was mistaken for a hostile enemy and a land mine was detonated. He died as a result of fragmentation wounds to the body. He was assigned to the 1st Cavalry Division (Air Mobile). Gave his life on June 6, 1971. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 03W – Line 68.



Army SP4 Martin John Begosh, 20, of Rockville, Maryland. Begosh was killed in action as a result of hostile action when his helicopter crashed on land in Hua Nghia, South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 1st Aviation Brigade. Gave his life on August 18, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 48W, Line 37. Graduated from Richard Montgomery High School in 1965.



Army SGT John Anthony Bifareti, Jr., 24, of Rockville, Maryland. Bifareti was killed in action from multiple fragmentation wounds in Binh Duong, South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 14th Infantry, 25th Infantry Division. Gave his life on May 17, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 61E, Line 23. Graduated from high school in Pittsburgh in 1960 and attended the University of Notre Dame.

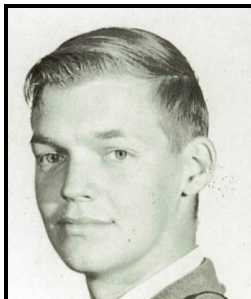

Army SP5 Harold Douglas Biller, 21, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Biller was killed in action when his vehicle hit a land mine near Nui Dat, South Vietnam. He was assigned to 175th Radio Relay Company, 509th Army Security Agency Group. Gave his life on February 25, 1969. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 31W – Line 43rd. Graduated from Wheaton High School in 1965 and attended the University of Maryland.



Marine Corps Pvt William Ronald Bissell, 19, of Cabin John, Maryland. Bissell was killed in action from small arms fire while on a patrol in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He was assigned to Company E, 27th Marines, 1st Marine Division. Gave his life on May 22, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 65E, Line 5. Graduated from Walt Whitman High School in 1966 and served on Cabin John Volunteer Fire Department.



Army PFC William Joseph Boehm, 19, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Boehm was killed in action from multiple fragmentation wounds in Kontum, South Vietnam. He was assigned to A Company, 2nd Battalion, 503rd Infantry Regiment, 173rd Airborne Brigade. Gave his life on June 22, 1967. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 22E, Line 36. Graduated St. John's High School in 1965 and attended Montgomery College.



Marine Corps LCpl John Michael Bowers, 21, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Bowers was killed in action from small arms fire in Quang Ngai, South Vietnam. He was assigned to E Company, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, 3rd Marine Division. Gave his life on March 21, 1966. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 06E, Line 28. Graduated from Northwood High School in 1963.

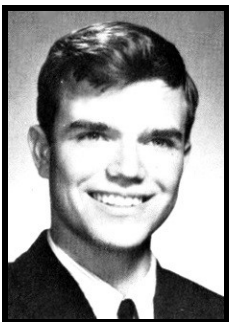

Army SP4 Richard Bert Bruce, 23, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Bruce died of non-combat injuries in Gia Dinh, South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 1st Signal Brigade. Gave his life on March 18, 1969. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 29W, Line 68.



Air Force Capt Robert Newton Brumet, 36, of Bethesda, Maryland. Brumet was killed in air action southwest of Saigon, South Vietnam and died while missing. His body was recovered. He was assigned to 1st Air Commando Squadron, 34th Tactical Group, 13th Air Force. Gave his life on April 9, 1964. Served 16 years in the military.



Army CPL Lance Dunham Brunson, 20, of Garrett Park, Maryland. Brunson died of non-combat related injuries while on a combat mission near Saigon, South Vietnam. He was assigned to A Company, 2nd Battalion, 101st Airborne Division. Gave his life on August 6, 1967. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 24E, Line 82. Graduated from Albert Einstein High School in 1966.



Marine Corps LCpl Charles Gilman Butler, Jr., 20, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Butler was killed in action from small arms fire while on patrol in Quang Tin, South Vietnam. He was assigned to Headquarters and Service Company, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, 1st Marine Division. Gave his life on August 1, 1967. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 24E, Line 59. Graduated from Springbrook High School in 1965.

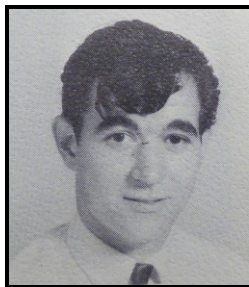

Navy EON3 Francis Edward Camden, Jr., 19, of Wheaton, Maryland. Camden was killed in action from multiple fragmentation wounds in Thua Thien, South Vietnam. He was assigned to Naval Mobile Construction Battalion 62, 3rd Naval Construction Brigade. Gave his life on January 20, 1967. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 14E, Line 55. Attended Sligo Junior High School.



Marine Corps Pfc Darrell Edward Campanello, 18, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Campanello was killed in action from an explosive device while on patrol in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He was assigned to 1st Marine Division. Gave his life on June 3, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 61W, Line 21. Attended Springbrook High School.



Army SGT John Alan Capasso, 20, of Rockville, Maryland. Capasso was killed in action from wounds suffered from an explosive device in Phu Yen, South Vietnam. He was assigned to Company D, 503rd Infantry, 173rd Airborne Brigade. Gave his life on May 7, 1970. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 11W, Line 121. Graduated from Richard Montgomery High School in 1967.

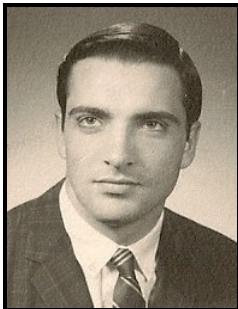

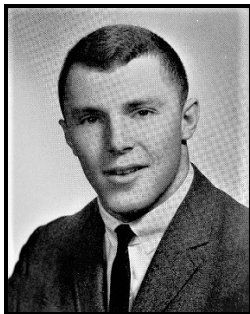

Graduated from Wheaton High School in 1966.



Marine Corps 1stLt Lewis Edgar Casner, Jr., 25, of Potomac, Maryland. Casner was killed in action in a helicopter crash in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He was assigned to Marine Light Helicopter Squadron-167, Marine Aircraft Group 16, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, III Marine Expeditionary Force. Gave his life on July 19, 1970. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 08W, Line 31.



Marine Corps 2ndLt William J. Christman, III, 23, of Gaithersburg, Maryland. Christman was killed in action from small arms fire in Quang Tri, South Vietnam. He was assigned to A Company, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines, 3rd Marine Division. Gave his life on February 22, 1969. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 32W, Line 77. Graduated from Gaithersburg High School in 1963 and Concord College, Athens, West Virginia in 1968.



Army SP4 Larry Monroe Clark, 20, of Olney, Maryland. Clark was killed in action from small arms fire in South Vietnam. He was assigned to Company C, 12th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division. Gave his life on February 2, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 36E, Line 68.

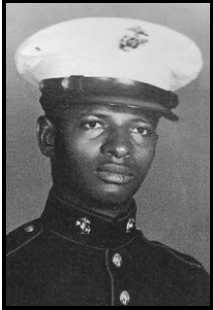

Army CPT James Michael Coyle, 25, of Rockville, Maryland. Coyle was killed in action as an advisor to the Vietnamese Army's 7th Division in Kein Hoa Province, South Vietnam. He was assigned to 41st ARVN Ranger Battalion, SD-5891, Headquarters, Military Assistance Command, Vietnam Advisors. Gave his life on August 20, 1964. Graduated from high school in Turkey, and the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1961.



Marine Corps LCpl Kevin Mark Coyne, 21, of Silver Spring, Maryland. Coyne was killed in action by small arms fire while on patrol in Quang Nam, South Vietnam. He was assigned to A Company, 1st Battalion, 26th Marines, 3rd Marine Division. Gave his life on June 7, 1968. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 59W, Line 21. Graduated from Our Lady of Good Counsel High School in 1965 and attended Montgomery College.

Army SP4 Richard Savage Cunningham, 22, of Spencerville, Maryland. Cunningham was killed in action by small arms fire in Cambodia. He was assigned to H Company, 2nd Squadron, 11th Armored Cavalry. Gave his life on May 14, 1970. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 10W, Line 39. Attended Good Counsel High School, graduated from Staunton Military Academy in Staunton, VA in 1966, and attended Montgomery College.

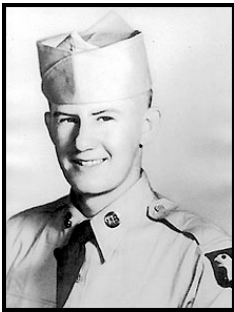

Attended Gaithersburg High School and received his diploma in the service.



Army 1LT Patrick A. Deck, Jr., 35, of Chevy Chase, Maryland. Deck died at Walter Reed 11 years after receiving multiple fragmentation wounds during combat in North Vietnam. He was assigned to A Company, 502nd Aviation Battalion, 12th Combat Aviation Group. Gave his life on February 2, 1977. Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 01W, Line 63.

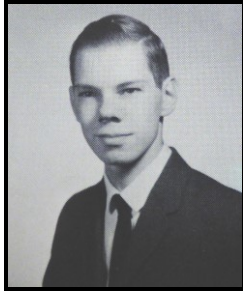

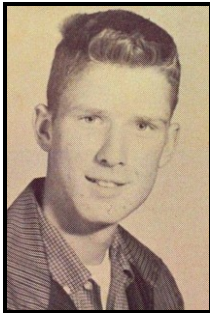

Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall Panel 64W, Line 8. Attended Albert Einstein High School and earned equivalency diploma.
