disabilities, and offers resources to help people to remain
in the community safely and independently. Resources
that may be discussed include, but are not limited to: long
term care planning, assistance with activities of daily
living, adult day care; home health care; transportation
options; File of Life, senior centers; adult foster care;
group homes; assisted living; nutrition and mental health
options. ADRU is also the entry point for customers for an
intake for case management services, including Adult
Protective Services (APS). The Office has workers to
discuss caller concerns and situations and, if needed, for
any additional follow-up.

All Montgomery County recruits and officers receive training and education on ensuring positive, effective, and safe interactions between law enforcement and the Autism/IDD communities. The unit also works with caregivers and those with Autism/IDD on ways to ensure they are safe in the community. Outreach Program provides a layered approach to Alzheimer's / Autism / IDD safety and awareness through education, follow up, and response. Upon request, Montgomery County Police provide wearable ID bracelets to County residents at risk of wandering and getting lost. These can help first responders and others identify a family caregiver to contact in the event an individual becomes lost or needs medical help and cannot fully explain their situation. Hold community events such as Spectacular Kids Night Out and Autism/IDD Night Out throughout the year. Conduct presentations within and outside of the County. .

Services include Adult Educational ESOL Classes through the Learning English Together English Literacy Program; citizenship and immigration information and referrals; basic computer and phone tech classes; financial fitness education classes and referrals to the Financial Empowerment Center for free education and coaching; housing assistance, counseling, education, and referrals; parenting education classes; job readiness training programs and referrals; advocacy for parents and school engagement; and case management and assistance accessing community resources such as clothing, food, furniture, medical, dental, behavioral health, and legal help. Services are offered free of charge in English and Spanish to City of Gaithersburg Residents. The Center is a collaboration between JSSA, the City of Gaithersburg, and Montgomery County Public Schools.

Emergency respite care is for an unplanned event that requires the unavoidable absence of the primary caregiver. Services are available within 72 hours (3 days) across Maryland and across the lifespan – any age, any disability. Offer quality care if your favorite respite provider is not available. Pre-registration options available, including resource identification. Approval for emergency respite will be determined within 48 hours of request. A family may only make one request per 12-month period and the maximum grant per family is \$225 per 12-month period. Funded by the Maryland Department of Human Services.
