Services include academic, career, and short-term personal counseling; assistance with admission, course selection and registration; interpretation and maintenance of students' confidential documentation of disability; authorization of accommodations based on documentation of disability; assistance with classroom accommodations such as notetakers, readers, scribes, assistive listening devices (on loan) and sign language interpreters; arrangements for recorded texts through Recordings for the Blind and Dyslexic (RFB&D); accommodations Letters and liaison with faculty to arrange accommodations; arrangements for examinations, such as extended time or minimal-distraction environment; assistive technology including computers with disability-specific software and hardware; document conversion to alternative formats; liaison with external agencies such as the Division of Rehabilitative Services (DORS); and voter registration assistance and forms. Services including reasonable accommodations are provided in compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, 2009.
