For example, if your health plan has refused to cover a medical procedure or pay for a medical service for a consumer; if you need help resolving a billing dispute with a health care provider, such as a hospital, doctor or dentist; or if you need assistance resolving a dispute about medical equipment that was defective or was never delivered. The Unit also helps consumers who have been denied enrollment in a Qualified Health Plan or denied Advanced Premium Tax Credits or Cost-Sharing Reductions by Maryland Health Connection. Maryland law also allows providers to file complaints against inusrance carriers on behalf of consumers. Complaints can be filed online or via hard copy.

Medicare is health insurance for the following: people 65 or older; people under 65 with certain disabilities, and people of any age with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) (permanent kidney failure requiring dialysis or a kidney transplant).

Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) helps cover inpatient care in hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, hospice, lab tests, surgery, and and home health care. Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) helps cover doctors' services, hospital outpatient care, home health care, durable medical equipment, and covers some preventive services to help maintain your health and to keep certain illnesses from getting worse. Medicare Part D (Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage) is a prescription drug option run by

Coverage) is a prescription drug option run by Medicare-approved private insurance companies, helps cover the cost of prescription drugs, and may help lower your prescription drug costs and help protect against higher costs in the future.
