

<p>2015 Planning</p>	<p>The group also suggested that the CoA recruit nursing homes to become members of the commission.</p> <p>Arva will present the LTC Report Findings and Recommendations during the Exec Comm Meeting (conference call) on 9/11 for their insights, feedback, recommendations and approval.</p> <p>The group identified several potential speakers: Primary Care Coalition, HEALTH Partners, Holy Cross or Shady Grove to learn more about caregiver support and transition programs, Betsy Carrier from NEXUS Montgomery-a grant funded organization working to advance care coordination and health outcomes for people 65+ in independent and assisted living facilities in Montgomery County. The group also discussed inviting Nursing Home Administrators to present to the H&WC. The types of facilities (rehab vs. LTC, aging vs. intellectually disabled, private pay vs. Medicaid) were discussed, as were potential questions for the Administrators.</p>	<p>report and findings.</p> <p>Share thoughts about recruiting/sharing report with nursing homes or their administrators as members of CoA with Chair and Exec Comm.</p> <p>Ask Eileen Bennett to share her thoughts about which nursing homes (administrators) might be willing to talk with the H&WC. On 9.1 Eileen shared the following insights: From the ombudsman perspective, Hebrew Home is not the "best" indicator of challenges (or even success) because of its massive endowment funding. It is, indeed the largest nursing home licensed in the state and part of a life community, but not licensed as a CCRC (Continuing Care Retirement Community).
