The Chair welcomed Commissioners and guests. The Chair reminded Commissioners the Annual Report workgroup paragraphs are due in July. This deadline was moved to July 7<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>The next two COH meetings are July 20<sup>th</sup> and September 21<sup>s</sup> (retreat), there will be an August recess.</li> </ul>  | Workgroup leads to submit workgroup summary to Meghan by July 7 <sup>th</sup> . |
| MCDHHS Health Officer's Report Dr. Davis, Montgomery County Health Officer | <ul> <li>The County recently had the 1<sup>st</sup> case of measles since 2019. One isolated case with travel history. No spread associated with this case.</li> <li>Air Quality: last week some parts of the County reached Code Purple. 1<sup>st</sup> day of code purple in the region. County will need to prepare for poor air quality days.</li> <li>Cannabis legalization: official July 1<sup>st</sup> in Maryland. School system, Health Department and Police Department are working on communications.</li> <li>Opioids and Fentanyl: working to increase treatment access and facilities in the area for substance use. Currently, there are only outpatient options for youth.</li> <li>Question regarding DHHS' communication channels for environmental risks - Press release, social media and included in County Executive's "Things You Need to Know" Thursday messaging.</li> <li>Question regarding xylazine- Have seen cases in the County, all in adults over 18yrs old. Xylazine is an animal tranquilizer, there is no antidote and causes ulcers at the injection site.</li> </ul> |   |

|   | <ul> <li>Question regarding facility at Seven Locks Road, a proposed center for patients to connect to treatment facilities instead of jail and/or hospitals for substance use or mental health crisis. No update currently.</li> <li>Question regarding staffing to evaluate health impacts of climate impacts on our communities. Commissioner Gabriela urged DHHS to build points of synergy with environmental teams and offered support as needed. Commissioner also requested communication to workers and employers who are largely outside.</li> <li>Dr. Rogers provided an update on the Community Health Needs Assessment release date. Anticipating a fall release as it completes final review. Materials include infographic, community partnership summary booklets, town halls, social media venues and a County Council briefing.</li> </ul>   |   |

| Cannabis Administration Andrew Garrison, MCA Policy Director    | <ul> <li>Question: What percent of licenses are being allocated through the social equity lens? Every license issued in the state.</li> <li>Question: What group is responsible for the expungement process? Onus for expungement is on the State with a deadline of July 1, 2024.</li> <li>Question: Proximity to schools? Listed on pg. 69 of the bill. (B) except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a licensed dispensary may not locate within: (1) 500 feet of: (i) a pre—existing primary or secondary school in the state, or a licensed child care center or registered family child care home under title 9.5 of the education article; or (ii) a playground, recreation center, library, or public park; or (2) 1,000 feet of another dispensary under this title.</li> <li>Question about medical marijuana and regulations regarding prescribers- Challenges regarding who can prescribe. Providers and patients need to be registered with MCA.</li> <li>Consumption lounges will be flushed out further in future legislative sessions.</li> <li>Question about MCA's availability and willingness to speak with other communities. Andrew confirmed MCA is available and interested in additional presentations as requested.</li> </ul> |   |
