LET'S GET SOME PERSPECTIVE

• IN MOST PLACES A "ROUTINE" ACCIDENT IS THE GREATEST RISK

- **RESPONDERS, PUBLIC & WORKERS STILL ROUTINELY HURT**
- TOO MUCH RELIANCE ON STANDARDS, LISTS & THRESHOLDS TO DEFINE RISK
- PUBLIC DOES NOT HAVE A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY MISINFORMATION
- PLANNING GAPS FUNCTIONAL NEEDS, DISABILITIES & NON-ENGLISH SPEAKERS
- TOO RELIANT ON OUR SOPS





FEWA GUIDANCE - CPG 101

"When threatened by ... emergencies or disasters, people expect elected or appointed leaders to take immediate action...

They expect the government to marshal its resources... and solicit assistance from outside the jurisdiction if necessary.

The elected leaders in each jurisdiction are legally responsible for ensuring that ... actions are taken to protect people and property..."

CONTINUITY GUIDANCE CIRCULAR

"Planning across the full range of continuity operations is an <u>inherent</u> <u>responsibility</u> of every level of government."

"[E]nsure that essential functions continue to be performed..."

"Essential functions ... cannot be deferred during an emergency; ... legally mandated functions will be essential ..."

THE PLANNING PROCESS

- THE MOST RISKY PART OF EOPs

- THE PLANNING PROCESS IS WHERE CIVIL RIGHTS LAWSUITS COME FROM
 - KATRINA CASES
- AMERICAN'S WITH DISABILITIES ACT

- CAN'T BE DONE IN A VACUUM

- MUST EVALUATE RISKS, HAZARDS AND CAPABILITIES IN THE COMMUNITY
- MUST PLAN FOR VULNERABLE POPULATIONS
- THE PLANNING PROCESS NEEDS TO INCLUDE THOSE IMPACTED BY THE PLAN
 - INVITATION FOR LAWSUIT IF NOT

- FAIL TO BE SURE THAT PROTECTED PERSONS HAVE "ACCESS" TO SERVICES
 - AVAILABILITY ISN'T ENOUGH
- FAIL TO INVOLVE NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING COMMUNITIES
- FAIL TO INCORPORATE SERVICE ANIMALS IN PLANNING
 - CO-MINGLED VS CO-LOCATED

- OPPORTUNITY TO LIMIT LIABILITY IN COLORADO



GOLDEN RULES FOR LEPCS

- Know the hazards in your community.
 - Where there are hazardous substances?
 - What are the natural hazards?
 - What are the response capabilities?
 - What are the public capabilities?
- Educate public and business
 - What can happen to you?
 - What are their obligations?
- Create participation and cooperation
 - Public, authorities & industry
 - Have high expectations
