DESCRIPTION

This project provides for the rehabilitation of the Moneysworth Farm House so that it can be reused, including: full historic renovation of the Moneysworth Farm House; provisions for connections to public utilities; full code compliance; parking; and landscaping. The Moneysworth Farm is located on Site 30 in Clarksburg, the site of the Montgomery County Correctional Facility. The MCPS Kingsley Wilderness Project, which is located on Site 30, has been identified as the preferred reuse for the farm.

JUSTIFICATION

The Moneysworth Farm, which consisted of 103 acres, was designated as a historic site in 1976. It is the only remaining example of Tidewater Architecture in Montgomery County. Rehabilitation of the farm house is required as part of the agreement by the Montgomery County Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) to reduce the designated historic area to approximately 25 acres, which was approved in the fall of 1997. Rehabilitation is also required by the Maryland Historic Trust as a part of fund approval for the Montgomery County Correctional Facility. The cost estimate is based on rehabilitation standards which would be required by the Maryland Historic Trust for the farm house. Provisions for water and sewer to the site are included in the Montgomery County Correctional Facility project.

Plans and Studies

An archaeological investigation was undertaken in FY98 on the Moneysworth Farm site and was funded in the Montgomery County Correctional Facility project.

Cost Change

Cost increase due to construction cost escalation. Current cost is based on the most recent bid price.

STATUS

The project is now divided into two phases. Phase one is the stabilization of the structure (FY06) and phase two will be the remainder of the restoration (FY07).
