

# Board of Appeals

## MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Board of Appeals is to implement the flexibility provided in the Zoning Ordinance as approved by the County Council and to assist County citizens in understanding and participating in the special exception, variance, and administrative appeal process.

## BUDGET OVERVIEW

The total approved FY09 Operating Budget for the Board of Appeals is \$619,300, an increase of \$32,290 or 5.5 percent from the FY08 Approved Budget of \$587,010. Personnel Costs comprise 87.9 percent of the budget for four full-time positions for 4.7 workyears. Operating Expenses account for the remaining 12.1 percent of the FY09 budget.

<sup>4</sup>County Code requires mailing of written notices of hearings within 7 days after the filing of any appeal, petition for special exception, request for a variance, or other matter within the Board's jurisdiction.

<sup>5</sup>County Code requires that the hearings for special exceptions be held not fewer than 60 days and that the hearing on any other matter within the Board's jurisdiction be held not fewer than 30 days following the issuance of the written notice of hearing.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

### Zoning Related Hearings and Administrative Appeals

The Board of Appeals hears requests for special exceptions and variances as provided in the Zoning Ordinance. The Zoning Ordinance requires that requests for certain uses (special exceptions) be considered for approval by the Board. Development standards for each zone are also set by the Zoning Ordinance. Variances from these standards require approval by the Board. The Board of Appeals also holds hearings and rules on appeals from administrative actions of certain governmental departments and agencies, as provided in the County Code.
