Description

Enrollment projections at Westland Middle School and the plan to reassign Grade 6 students from Chevy Chase and North Chevy Chase elementary schools to the middle school level, will result in a total cluster middle school enrollment of approximately 1,600 students. This projected enrollment would far exceed the current capacity of Westland Middle School. Therefore, a new middle school is needed in the cluster to accommodate the projected enrollment. A feasibility study was conducted to determine the cost and scope of the project. An FY 2014 appropriation was approved to begin planning this new school.
