Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Definitions

Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) definitions used by Montgomery County

Part I Crimes: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, auto theft

Part II Crimes: minor assaults, arsons, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, sexual offenses, controlled dangerous substance violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) definitions used by the FBI

Violent Crimes: murder, rape, robbery and aggravated assault

Property Crimes: burglary, larceny/theft, motor vehicle theft
