### Historical Timeline

- 1634**.....First European Settlers arrived on the shores of Maryland. The area that is now Montgomery County was inhabited by members of the Piscataway Confederacy
- 1695**.....Europeans began to settle along Rock Creek
- 1776**.....Frederick County was divided into three counties Frederick, Montgomery and Washington
- 1801**.....The name of the county seat was changed from Williamsburg to Rockville
- 1860**.....Free public school system was established
- 1861-1865**.....Confederate troops passed through the county during the Civil War
- 1891**.....The third Court House, which still stands to this day, was built
- 1948**.....Became the first county in the state to adopt a Home Rule Charter with a council form of government
- 1950**.....Montgomery County Public Library System created
- 1954**.....Montgomery County Schools began to desegregate
- 1968**.....A new charter was adopted, allowing a County Executive and a seven-member County Council
- 1976**.....United States and Montgomery County bicentennial
- 1981**.....Executive Office Building and Judicial Center were built
- 1990**.....The County Council expanded to nine members



## **Montgomery County Executive**

The Montgomery County Executive is elected to serve a four-year term and has official duties comparable to that of a city mayor. The County Executive is responsible for:

- Overseeing the implementation and enforcement of the laws of Montgomery County
- Providing executive direction to all departments
- Proposing plans, programs, budgets, policies, and legislation to the County Council
- Ensuring full protection of, and participation by, residents of all races, national origins and physical abilities
- Preparing the Public Services Program (PSP) and Operating Budget, Capital Improvements Program (CIP), annual update of the ten-year Water Supply and Sewage System Plan and the Solid Waste Management Plan

The County Executive may:

- Appoint department heads and members of boards, committees and commissions responsible to the executive branch. Most appointments require confirmation by the County Council
- Exercise an executive veto on any legislation passed by the County Council. The County Executive's veto can be overridden by a vote of six or more members of the County Council

## **Chief Administrative Officer (CAO)**

The Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) is appointed by the County Executive. The CAO is responsible for the supervision of all of the department heads and various agencies that comprise the Executive Branch.

## **Montgomery County Council**

The County Council is composed of nine members who are elected for four-year terms of office. The county is divided into five councilmanic districts. Each district is represented by one council member who must reside in that district and is elected only by voters living in that district. In addition, four at-large representatives, who may reside anywhere in the county, are elected by all county voters. Except for powers reserved to the state, the County Council has ultimate law-making authority in county government. The Council:

- Passes legislation
- Adopts the budget and sets the tax rate
- Exercises planning, zoning, and subdivision responsibilities
- Appoints people to committees and commissions that are directly responsible to the legislative branch
- Confirms appointments made by the County Executive to Boards, Commissions and Committees

The County Council meets regularly on Tuesdays. The County Charter, the legal document that outlines how the county is governed, limits the number of times that the Council may meet to pass legislation to no more than 45 times per year. However, Council members may hold as many public hearings, work sessions and committee meetings as necessary to perform their job. Council meetings are open to the public except on rare occasions when the Council goes into “executive session” to deal with specific legal or personnel matters. The public is encouraged to share their views with the Council in writing and at public hearings. Individuals must sign up in advance if they wish to speak.

Council members serve on six committees each of which have three members. These committees study and make recommendation on issues that the Council will be addressing.

The committees are:

Education (ED)

Planning, Housing and Economic Development (PHED)

Health and Human Services (HHS)

Management and Fiscal Policy (MFP)

Transportation and Environment (T&E)

Public Safety (PS)

## **County Boards, Committees and Commissions**

### **Background**

The County Executive and County Council encourage individuals who live and work in Montgomery County to become actively involved in matters affecting quality of life in the county. The County Executive appoints members to over 75 Boards, Committees, and Commissions (B/C/Cs), most of which require County Council confirmation. Generally, B/C/C members meet one or two evenings per month, hold three-year terms and serve in an advisory capacity. Most members of B/C/Cs are not compensated but can be reimbursed for travel and dependent care expenses. Vacancies are advertised and often published by area newspapers.

### **Application**

To find out which B/C/Cs have vacancies check out the county web site or call the Office of the County Executive. To apply:

- Send a letter of interest addressed to the County Executive, 101 Monroe Street, Rockville MD, 20850
- Include the name of the B/C/C you would like to serve on and the type of position applying for (if applicable)
- Include a personal statement about why you are interested in that B/C/C
- Include a resume with home address, home/work telephone numbers and a clear statement of your current employment
- If you are retired, describe your work experience

- Requests for special exception or land uses which are allowed by the zoning ordinance according to specific conditions
- Applications for variances from development standards by land owners who want to build on their lots in areas or in ways that are not otherwise allowed by the zoning ordinance
- Appeals from certain decisions or actions of county agencies

Disagreements with the decisions of the Board of Appeals may be taken to the Circuit Court.

The mission of the Department of Environmental Protection is to protect and enhance the quality of life in our community through the conservation, preservation, and restoration of our environment, guided by the principles of science, resource management, sustainability, and stewardship. It has enforcement capabilities and may write citations for illegal dumping, as well as noise, air and water pollution.

- **Office of the Director** – provides the overall policy direction for all programs, projects and activities in the Department of Environmental Protection. It provides management services for the entire department including budget, human resources, procurement, information technology, information and referral, and outreach and public education. In addition, the Water and Wastewater Policy Group within the Office of the Director coordinates issues related to the availability and extension of the community water supply (drinking water) and sewer service, water quality issues related to water supply and wastewater disposal, biosolids management, and groundwater protection. This Group also serves as the main county liaison with the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and the D.C. Water and Sewer Authority including state and regional coordination on related topics
- **Division of Policy and Compliance** – develops, analyzes, and enforces policies and regulations relating to air and water quality, energy conservation, noise and other environmental nuisance issues, resource management and pollution prevention, and forest and tree protection and enhancement
- **Division of Watershed Management** – monitors water quality and habitat conditions in the county's streams, builds stream restoration projects to replace or repair damaged stream habitat, manages severe channel erosion problems, inspects and enforces maintenance of facilities constructed to capture and manage stormwater runoff, and is responsible for the county's Water Quality Protection Charge that appears on the property tax bill

The District Court handles civil cases involving less than \$25,000 in value and most criminal cases where the punishment does not exceed 3 years incarceration or a fine of \$2,500. There are no jury trials in the District Court. If a person has a right to a trial by jury and demands a jury trial, the case will be transferred to the Circuit Court. District Court cases cover a wide variety of issues including:

- Landlord-tenant disputes
- Claims which seek the recovery of goods or property
- Motor vehicle violations, ranging from parking tickets to driving under the influence of alcohol
- Criminal misdemeanors and certain felonies
- Bail and preliminary hearings for any crime charged in Maryland

More serious cases, and all cases requiring a jury, are handled by the Circuit Court. For example, any civil case involving more than \$25,000 is heard in the Circuit Court, but a case involving between \$10,000 and \$25,000 could also be heard in the Circuit Court if the plaintiff (the person, group or institution filing the complaint) or the defendant (the person, group, or institution being accused) requests a jury trial. Circuit Court

judges also hear appeals from the District Court and certain administrative agencies. Although references are made to “Juvenile Court,” there are not separate juvenile courts in Maryland. All juvenile cases are heard in Circuit Court. In all Maryland counties, except Montgomery and Harford, the Orphans’ Court handles estates of deceased persons and the appointment of guardians for children whose deceased parents did not designate a guardian in a will. In Montgomery County, these cases are handled by the Circuit Court.

The highest court in Maryland is the Court of Appeals. It primarily hears appeals of decisions made by the Court of Special Appeals. The Court of Appeals also has exclusive jurisdiction in appeals of death penalty cases, legislative redistricting, removal of certain public officials and certification of questions of law.

- Public Housing - HOC owns and manages approximately 1,500 units of public housing for low income individuals and families, including more than 550 apartments in four high rise elderly housing buildings

- Section 236 Housing (multifamily buildings that were federally subsidized prior to 1978 such as Bauer Park)

M-NCPPC was established by the Maryland General Assembly in 1927 to operate a park system and provide land use planning for the physical development of the great majority of Montgomery and Prince George's Counties and to operate public recreation programs in Prince George's County. Ten members, five appointed from Montgomery County and five from Prince George's County make up the Commission. The Montgomery County Planning Board consists of the Montgomery County members of the M-NCPPC. The Planning Board, made up of four members and a chair, advises and assists the County Council and Executive in planning, zoning, and acquiring and maintaining park land. The Board prepares master plans and other types of plans such as transportation plans and open space preservation plans. It reviews and comments on proposals for all items related to land use that are initiated by other departments of government.

For land use regulatory items such as subdivisions, site plans, and project plans, the Planning Board has final authority to approve, deny or modify proposed plans. Weekly meetings of the Planning Board, usually held on Thursdays, are open to the public, and public hearings precede final decisions on almost all matters.

The Parks Department oversees the acquisition, development and management of the park system. Parks provide residents with open space for recreational opportunities and natural resources stewardship. The department is responsible for nearly 33,000 acres of parkland.

# Financing County Government

## The Budget Process

The County Executive, with assistance from the Office of Management and Budget, prepares the short and long-term operating and capital budgets. The Board of Education, Montgomery College, and the bi-county agencies (such as WSSC), prepare their budgets separately and submit them for inclusion in the Executive's budget. The County Council approves the budgets and sets tax rates. The County Charter contains several provisions designed to limit excessive budget growth:

- Spending Affordability Guidelines (SAG)** – The Council uses information such as estimated revenues, inflation trends, demographic trends, employment levels and state requirements to set a ceiling on funding from property tax revenues and a ceiling on total tax-supported appropriations in the operating budget
- **Super Majority Provisions** – The aggregate budget cannot grow more than the Consumer Price Index – Urban (CPI-U) for the Washington metropolitan area without at least six votes of the County Council. The votes of seven Council members are required to increase property tax revenues (excluding new property) above the prior year's level plus the Washington area CPI-U. It also takes seven votes to exceed the guidelines outlined in the spending affordability process
  - **Executive Veto** – The Executive may veto or reduce items approved by the Council

**Public Input** - The county encourages resident participation in the budget process. Residents and advisory groups work with specific departments to convey their concerns and priorities as departmental requests are prepared for the County Executive. The County Council holds hearings that by law must begin at least 21 days after receipt of the Budget from the Executive. Public hearings are advertised in local newspapers.

## **Types of Budgets:**

- **Operating Budget** – a plan for the level of spending and required revenues for county programs for a single year
- **Capital Budget** – the annual request for funding for capital projects (public buildings, roads, etc.)
- **Capital Improvement Program** – a comprehensive presentation of the projected expenditures and funding requirements for capital projects for a six-year period that is produced every other year in even-numbered years - also contains the annual capital budget appropriations to fund project activity during the first year of the plan
- **Public Services Program (PSP)** – A forecast of public service requirements over the next six years, submitted annually by the Executive to the County Council. Its purpose is to provide guidance for the orderly planning of services with regard to population changes, socio-economic variables, potentially needed public facilities, and anticipated new or changing needs of county citizens. The PSP includes the County Executive's fiscal policy statements. The first year of the PSP is referred to as the operating budget

## **Budget Cycles**

### **Montgomery County Budget Timeline**

- November - Spending Affordability process begins for the operating budget
- December - By the third Tuesday, after a public hearing, the County Council sets the Spending Affordability Guidelines (SAG) for the following fiscal year
- January 15th (even numbered years) - Proposed Capital Improvements Program (six-year plan for construction projects) is published
- January 15th (all years) - Proposed Capital Budget for the following fiscal year is published
- January-March - Departments and Agencies prepare budgets that are analyzed by the Office of Management and Budget and reviewed by the Executive
- March 15th - Proposed Public Services Program (six-year plan) is published
- March 15th - The proposed operating budget for the following fiscal year is published

- End of April - By the second Tuesday after the General Assembly adjourns; the County Council may, by simple majority vote, increase or decrease, the SAG to reflect a significant change in the financial picture. However, any increase in the aggregate operating budget may not exceed any projected increase in net revenues. By the third Tuesday, each agency and the Executive must specify how reductions would be made if the Council reduces the SAG
- April - May - Public hearings and review of the budget by the County Council
- June 1 - The County Council approves the Operating and Capital Budgets. If the aggregate operating budget exceeds the SAG, it must be approved by seven of the nine Council members
- July 1 - The fiscal year begins

### **Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) Budget Timeline**

- Summer - Preliminary research and planning
- Early fall - The preliminary budget estimate for the following year is reviewed by MCPS units, principals, executive staff, and community members
- Late December - The Superintendent submits the budget to the Board of Education
- Jan-Feb - The Board of Education holds work sessions and public hearings
- March 1 - The Operating budget is submitted to County Executive
- April/May - The County Council holds hearing(s) on the MCPS budget
- June - The Board of Education makes adjustments to conform with Council action
- June 30 - The Board of Education submits a final budget to the County
- July 1 - The fiscal year begins

### **Sources of Revenue**

The state constitution gives the General Assembly all taxing authority. Through legislation, the General Assembly may grant general or specific powers to local governments. Among the tax collection powers held by the state are:

### **Montgomery County:**

- Must impose an income tax on individuals using a rate between 1.0% - 3.2% of Maryland State taxable income
- Must impose a property tax. Property taxes and income taxes are by far the largest sources of revenue for Montgomery County. While the ratio of one to the other varies with the economic climate, together they account for nearly 70% of local revenue
- Collects transfer and recordation taxes
- Collects certain excise taxes
- Charges fees for services

### **Local Income Tax**

Prior to 1998 the local income tax was computed as a percentage of the Maryland State income tax. This was called the piggyback tax and it was required to be no less than 20% nor more than 60% of the State income tax. Due to various changes in the computation of the State income tax at that time, including a decrease in the tax rate and a doubling of the exemption amount, the local income tax was changed from a piggyback to an actual tax rate applied to State taxable income. The rate must be between 1.0% and 3.2%. The current local income tax rate used in Montgomery County is 3.2%.

### **Property Tax**

Property taxes can be affected by the following:

- **Constant Yield Rate** - Each year the state assesses real property (land and improvements) and determines the tax rate for each county that would raise the same revenue (excluding new construction) as the previous year. Counties may exceed this rate if they hold a public hearing. Montgomery County has placed additional restrictions on exceeding this rate. The state assesses property on a three-year cycle, reassessing one third of the county each year. This means that similar pieces of property in different parts of the county can be valued differently depending on the cycle

- **Municipal District Property Tax** - Each municipal area within the county levies this tax. It is used by the municipalities for services such as street and sidewalk maintenance, trash removal, tree care, sanitation and police protection
- **Special Taxing Districts** - A geographic area, established by legislation, where taxes are levied to provide specific services
- **State Property Tax** - The state must levy property taxes on real property for the payment of principle and interest on state bonds
- **Limits on annual increases** - State law prohibits increasing the taxable assessment of owner occupied property by more than 10% per year. The County Charter requires that property tax revenues may not increase more than the rate of inflation unless a supermajority (7 of 9) of the County Council votes to override this requirement. Revenue from new construction is excluded from this limitation
- **Property Tax Relief Programs** - The Homeowner's Property Tax Credit Program and the new Senior Property Tax Credit (effective 2007), administered by the State, are available to eligible homeowners based on household income and, in the case of the Senior credit, an age requirement. *Applications must be filed no later than September 1st of each tax year. For information or an application, call the State at: 1-800-944-7403.* Disabled veterans and blind persons who are exempt from property taxes under State law may apply for a refund of property taxes for the past three years. *For information or an application, call SDAT at 301-279-1355. For information on filing a claim for refund, call the Division of Treasury at 240-777-8995*

### **State Aid**

The state makes grants of funds for many county services. The amount of many of these grants is based partially on the county's wealth as compared to other local jurisdictions. Because Montgomery County is a high-wealth county it receives relatively less in state aid than other jurisdictions. The largest state grants go for education followed by transportation, health and human services, and public safety.

### Background

Seven adult members are elected to the Montgomery County Board of Education for staggered four-year terms. Board members are elected countywide but two run at-large and five run from the Board district in which they reside. Every two years, all voters, regardless of where they live, may vote for one at-large candidate and one candidate from each district that is up for election. Two district seats are elected during presidential elections and three are elected during gubernatorial elections. Elections for the Board of Education are non-partisan and therefore, all registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote in the primary. The top two vote-getters in each race go on to compete in the general elections. A student member, who must be a junior or senior, is elected by all secondary students in MCPS schools to a one-year term on the Board. Duties include:

- Formulating and interpreting policies that govern the Montgomery County Public Schools
- Appointing the Superintendent of Schools
- Initiating, reviewing, and discussing educational issues
- Adopting and requesting annual capital and operating budgets
- Receiving funding from state and federal sources
- Establishing school boundaries
- Approving curriculum recommended by the superintendent
- Deciding appeals brought by students, parents, and staff
- Advancing a legislative agenda before the General Assembly

### Voter Registration

In order to vote in Montgomery County you must be:

- A United States citizen
- A Montgomery County resident
- At least 18 years of age on or before the next General Election

You may not register to vote if you:

- Have been convicted more than once of a disqualifying crime
- Are under a sentence imposed pursuant to conviction of an infamous crime
- Are under guardianship for mental disability

You may have a form mailed to you by calling the Board of Election's 24-hour voter information line and leaving your name and address after the recorded message. Forms may also be downloaded by visiting [www.777vote.org](http://www.777vote.org). All voting materials in Montgomery County are available in English and Spanish.

You may register to vote at any time. However, voter registration is closed from 21 days before until 11 days after the primary election, and 21 days before until 11 days after the general election. Voter registration applications received while the voter rolls are closed are processed when voter registration reopens. You are not registered to vote until you receive a voter notification card from the Board of Elections. If you have not received a card within three (3) weeks of sending in your application, please call the Board of Elections office.

The voter notification card includes your name, address, party affiliation, polling place location, and representative election districts.

### **Registering as a Member of a Political Party**

The Voter Registration Form will ask you if you consider yourself a:

- Democrat
- Republican
- Green Party
- Unaffiliated (decline to join a party)
- Other (with a place to fill in which other party)
- Constitution
- Libertarian
- Populist

Only those voters who have registered as a member of a party may vote in that party's primary election. All voters, including those who have not indicated a party preference may vote in the Board of Education primary because it is a non-partisan election. All voters may vote for members of any party they choose in the general election.

### **Changing or Updating Voter Registration**

Changes to your name, address, or party affiliation must be made in writing and signed by the voter. Changes can be made at any time voter registration is open, however, changes of party affiliation must be made at least 12 weeks before the day of the primary election. Forms for voter registration changes are available at the Board of Elections or may be downloaded from their web page. You may also send any changes in writing to the elections office. You must include your date of birth, name, address and party affiliation as you are currently registered and the change you wish to make. Be sure to sign and date the change request before mailing it or faxing it to the Board of Elections.

### **Volunteering to Register Voters**

The Board of Elections provides training for individuals wishing to register other people to vote. Information about this training is available on their web page and by calling their office.

### **Polling Places**

To vote by absentee ballot:

You must first fill out and return an Absentee Ballot Application. An application may be obtained by downloading one from the Board of Elections web site or calling, faxing or visiting the Board of Elections. Applications should be submitted 4-6 weeks before the election and should be received by the Board of Elections no later than 10 days before an election.

Late absentee ballots may be issued after that. You or an authorized person must apply for the absentee ballot in person at the Board of Elections office. After you receive your ballot, vote the ballot and return it to the Board of Elections before or by 8pm on an election day. A ballot received by the Board of Elections will be considered timely provided:

It has been received prior to the closing of the polls on Election Day

It was mailed on or before Election Day, (bearing a postmark verifying that fact) and the ballot is received from the postal service or private mail carrier by 10 am on the second Wednesday after a primary election preceding a gubernatorial election

It was mailed on or before Election Day, (bearing a postmark verifying that fact) and the ballot is received from the postal service or private mail carrier by 10 am on the second Friday after a general or special election or in a primary election preceding a presidential election

Untimely absentee ballots will not be counted.

## Provisional Ballots

The provisional ballot is a safeguard that ensures that no one who asserts that he or she is registered and eligible to vote will be prevented from casting a ballot on Election Day. It will only be counted after the local board of elections has reviewed the application and determined that the individual is registered and eligible to vote. You may request a provisional ballot if:

- You are not listed on the precinct register but you believe you are
- registered to vote in Maryland
- You registered by mail after January 1, 2003 and have not yet been able to provide the required identification
- You were sent an absentee ballot, but you did not turn it in
- Your right to vote has been challenged

## Types of Elections

In Maryland, statewide elections are held every two years and are called either Presidential Elections or Gubernatorial Elections.

In **Presidential Election Years** (2008, 2012, 2016, etc.) the following offices are elected:

- President and Vice President of the United States
- U.S. Senator (if the six-year term of either Senator is expiring)
- Representative to the U.S. House of Representatives
- Three members of the County Board of Education
- Judges
  - Circuit Court - Judges appointed by the Governor since the last election must stand for approval by the voters and may be challenged by other candidates
  - Appellate Court- Judges run strictly on their record with no opposition, where voters vote YES or NO to retain
- Delegates to party nominating conventions

In **Gubernatorial Election Years** (2010, 2014, 2018, etc.) the following offices are elected:

- U.S. Senator (if the six-year term of either Senator is expiring)
- Representative to the U.S. House of Representatives
- Governor and Lieutenant Governor of Maryland
- Comptroller
- Attorney General
- State Senators

- State Delegates
- State's Attorney
- Clerk of the Circuit Court
- Register of Wills
- County Executive
- All nine members of the County Council
- Four members of the County Board of Education
- Judges (see above)
- Members of the Democratic and Republican Central Committees
