





- Building will include:
 - gymnasium
 - exercise room

 - kitchen

 - arts/kiln room

- Scheduled to open in late Spring 2016 - Currently more than 60% complete!

▶ Brown Station Elementary School:

- ▶ Revitalization/Expansion project increasing capacity from 436 to 709 students
- ▶ Expected project completion August 2017
- ▶ Holding School: Emory Grove for SY16-17

▶ Jones Lane Elementary School:

- ▶ FY 2007 feasibility study was conducted to determine scope of addition
- ▶ Updated to determine if larger addition should be constructed
- ▶ Addition completion to be determined in future CIP

▶ Thurgood Marshall Elementary School:

- ▶ FY 2008 feasibility study was conducted to determine scope of addition
- ▶ Addition completion to be determined in future CIP

Quince Orchard Cluster

- ▶ Fields Road Elementary School:
 - ▶ FY 2016 appropriation approved for facility planning for classroom addition
- ▶ Rachel Carson Elementary School:
 - ▶ FY 2007 feasibility study was conducted to determine scope of addition
 - ▶ Updated to determine if larger addition should be constructed
 - ▶ Consideration of new elementary school in Quince Orchard Cluster to be included in analysis

Wootton Cluster

- ▶ Dufief Elementary:
 - ▶ Revitalization/Expansion project approved
 - ▶ Completion date: August 2021
 - ▶ Move to Emory Grove holding school during SY19-20
- ▶ Cold Spring Elementary School:
 - ▶ Revitalization/Expansion project approved
 - ▶ Completion date: August 2021
 - ▶ Move to Grosvenor holding school January 2020
- ▶ Wootton High School:
 - ▶ Revitalization/Expansion project approved
 - ▶ Completion date: August 2021 for building and August 2022 for restoration of the site



Corridor Cities Transitway (CCT)


Projected Schedule:

- Fall 2015 - Completion of NEPA* process and 30% design
- Winter 2015/2016 – Initiate design activities
- Winter 2016/2017 – Begin right-of-way acquisitions/permitting/agreements

Dependent on Funding:

- Spring 2018 – Begin construction
- Spring 2021 - Begin operations

*NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act): This Act established a national policy for the environment and requires federal agencies, in cooperation with state and local governments, to consider the potential environmental consequences of their proposals.
