The AAC spent several months discussing the Bill 52-14 Pesticide Prohibitions.

All of the agricultural organizations participated in the public hearings and they are opposed to the legislation even though it exempts agriculture.

We do not believe the legislation is needed and it will only circumvent the authority of the Federal-EPA and the Maryland-MDA which regulates all pesticides registered for Restricted Use and General Use.

We do not believe the County Tax Payers can afford the costs to implement this legislation. With another significant revenue shortfall projected for FY16, how can the County pay for this legislation and what other programs or services will be negatively impacted?
