 Board voted (19 Yes, 0 No) to Approve 7/26/2023 Agendas and Minutes (Dawn Luedtke/2<sup>nd</sup> Chief Fitzgerald)

- 2. Agency Updates
  - Circuit Court (Judge Bonifant)
    - o 1,000 criminal and 3,000 custody
    - o Closed 1,350 more cases than year before
  - District Court (Judge Koch)
    - o Case Flow Analysis Report notes
      - Criminal at 90% within Time Standard
      - Traffic very behind: 8% behind Time Standard
        - Judge has added 11 Traffic dockets to catch up which will make it difficult for SAO, Public Defenders, and Officers
          - o Officers only get 3 days a month
          - Koch, McCarthy and Jones will work together to get this moving
  - State's Attorney's Office (John McCarthy)
    - o Thanks to both Judges for the consistent communication
  - Human Trafficking Prevention Committee Rep (Florence Jewell)
    - o The HTPC is currently focused on awareness, education and training
      - They have a Bus campaign running currently (in English and Spanish) on 12 buses and 5 bus stops with the National Human Trafficking Hotline # for folks to call with Tips or needing victim assistance
      - Oct 31 there is an MCPS training (1.5 hrs) for 500 ppl around "Human Trafficking 101"
      - Shady Grove Adventist is ready to receive victims (they are a trauma informed center with Medical and Shelter capabilities)
      - Hoping the "Healthcare for All" Bill will come back (high fiscal impact)
  - Victim Services Advocacy Board Rep (Kathryn Pontzer)
    - The Human Trafficking 101 class could be similar to the Suicide curriculum in Health
  - MCPD (Chief Jones)
    - o A member asked about whether we have good Trafficking data
      - Chief notes victims we have seen, have come from NY;
         Chinese Community
      - Work with federal agencies/ Lt. Estrada
- 3. Briefing: Pre-Release Center Update

#### **Summary:**

• Ben reviewed (via PowerPoint enclosed) the 50-year history of the Pre-Release Center which recently reopened (post covid) on April 16, 2023

- o 144 bed facility; 71 current Average Daily Population; 1 unit left to be open when more participants enter the program
- Of the 47 folks that have been released from the program, 36 have been successful
- The team is currently working on updating their website and new data analytics
- Members asked about the recidivism rate and if PRC became full, what then

#### 4. Briefing: Auto Thefts

Marcus Jones, Chief Montgomery County Police Department

#### **Summary**

- Chief Jones reviewed (via PowerPoint enclosed) the data around Auto Thefts, Juvenile Arrests & Referrals
  - 2,216 Auto Thefts in Montgomery County this year so far, as compared to 937 last year (for context-PG County is currently at 7,424 as compared to 2,598 last year)
  - o TikTok Challenge is real with focus on Hyundais & Kias
  - Public needs to be reminder to lock your doors and remove your key fobs from the car when you are not inside the car
  - Auto Theft is a car taken without the owners knowledge vs a Car Jacking is a car taken by force
- Members discussed the data around juvenile arrests and the referral process; challenges when there is no ability to arrest someone under 13 and immediately they are able to go right back out and do bad things again without any ramifications







### PRE COVID-AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION










- Expectation of work within 5 week from admission
