Scrap Metal Recycling at Your Apartment or Condominium, "It's The Law"



Implement a Successful Scrap Metal Recycling Program for your Property

Montgomery County requires all multi-family properties to have a recycling program on-site for mixed paper, commingled materials, yard trim, Christmas trees and scrap metal per Montgomery County Executive Regulation (ER) 15-04AM. As a property manager, it is your responsibility to ensure all scrap metal generated on your property is recycled and to educate your tenants and employees about the recycling program.

Scrap metal is an extremely valuable commodity and is easily recycled. Did you know that recycling just one ton of scrap metal saves 2,500 pounds of iron ore; 1,400 pounds of coal and 120 pounds of limestone from being used to produce new metal?

In addition to conserving natural resources, recycling scrap metal reduces the need for additional disposal facilities and capacity. It's easy to do. The following are some simple suggestions to setting up effective scrap metal recycling programs at your property.

1. Do your residents know what scrap metal is?

Metal (or predominantly metal) items are considered scrap metal. Believe it or not, most household appliances, including washer and dryers, stoves, ovens, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioner units and furnaces, can be recycled. Even metal doors, bed frames, and furniture can be recycled. You can improve resident's awareness of what
