SUBJECT: **Worksession: FY16 Operating Budget – School Resource Officers**

The Committee was last briefed on the School Resource Officer (SRO) program in October 2014. Since that time, there have been no staffing changes among the SROs assigned to the County's high schools. A School Assignment list is provided at ©1. There are currently 23 MCPD SROs, one Sheriff, two City of Rockville Police SROs, and one Gaithersburg Police Department SRO. MCPD's FY16 recommended budget includes \$1,776,072 for the program. The Sheriff's FY16 recommended budget includes \$111,872.

**Arrest Data:** Last year, MCPD provided arrest data by offense category for the full school year 2013-2014. At that time, the data provided did not only reflect SRO activity, but represented all arrest recorded at all high schools during the relevant hours. MCPD stated at that time it would provide SRO data that is tracked separately to give a more detailed picture of SRO encounter data and experience. That is provided on ©6-17 by month. This data reflect arrests and charges, as well as SRO interventions/mediations, and SRO presentations/classes taught. Below is a compilation of that data by school year (through March 2015).

The data show some contact with middle schools and some very limited contact with elementary schools. MCPD indicated the SROs continue to make regular visits to middle schools within their cluster. The Sheriff's Office stated the same and indicated that the Deputy Sheriff SRO has ongoing contact with the two feeder middle schools.

**SRO Engagement with Students:** Several SROs have become involved with the Truancy Prevention Program at the middle school level, as mentors for kids in the program. The SRO provides mentoring and counseling sessions with the student with the goal of becoming a more productive student. SROs are also doing "Officer Friendly" visits and presentations at elementary and middle schools.

The Sheriff's Office indicates that their SRO participates in the Brave and Bold program – which is unique to Magruder High School. It was formed by the school, parents, and community to increase awareness of underage substance abuse.

**Communication among SROs and School Staff:** MCPD advises that SROs continue to work with the school principals and security staff. The principals also have been asked to continue to include the SROs in their weekly meetings. MCPD command staff, the State's Attorney's Office, representative of the Principals' Bargaining Unit, and MCPS Officials continue to meet and discuss ongoing training opportunities, the new sex assault notification process, and other matters of mutual interest.

The Sheriff's Office, which provides a Deputy Sheriff SRO to Magruder High School, reports that its Deputy Sheriff SRO's office is co-located with the school security staff. She also carries an additional portable radio that allows direct communication with high school administrative staff and security personnel. She has also been issued a smart phone by the Sheriff's Office and a tablet by the school to ensure that she can maintain open communication with all stakeholders.

**Discussion Issues:**

- 1) The Sheriff's Office indicates its Deputy Sheriff SRO attended 40 hours of Crisis Intervention Training (CIT). Is this something that would be beneficial for all SROs?
- 2) What are the stakeholder's plans moving forward for the next school year in terms of potential additions to, or improvement of training, communication, or other issues?

## **Joint Education and Public Safety Committee SRO Update**

- 1. Please provide an updated list of SRO assignments.**

- 2. Please provide the FY16 recommended appropriation for the SROs (and the one Sheriff, if still applicable).**

There are no new FY16 appropriations for MCP, nor any other agency.

- 3. Please provide a brief update on any specific improvements, challenges, adjustments to operational practices that you've experienced this year.**

With the implementation of the new school discipline policy, more meetings between the Principal, SRO, and School Security are occurring to discuss the best way to handle incidents. This has led to enhanced communication and cooperation between all parties. We continue to stress looking at the totality of circumstances to determine what is in the best interest of the child and the overall school community. Mediations and/or interventions remain the preferred method for dealing with the majority of school based incidents while maintaining a safe environment.

- 4. What is the expectation for SRO involvement with middle schools?**

SROs have been advised to continue making regular visits to middle schools within their cluster. They continue to handle calls for service at the middle schools and many have become involved with the Truancy Program in designated middle schools. The Truancy Program allows opportunities for mentoring and counseling sessions with student with the goal of becoming a more productive student.

An additional benefit is that when these middle school students become high school students they will already have a relationship with an SRO, which will help make for a smoother transition.

Other proactive "Officer Friendly" visits and presentations at the elementary and middle schools are being encouraged.

- 5. When the Joint Committee was updated last October, you mentioned that the encounter data you provided was for the entire school, and not just what the SRO was involved with. At that time MCPD stated that going forward SRO data would be tracked separately to give a more detailed picture of SRO encounter data and experience. Has this separate data tracking been implemented? If so, please provide the most recent SRO encounter data by school (the number and types of calls, incidents, arrests). For the current school year if possible. If it hasn't been implemented, please provide the same data by school.**

The new tracking data system has been implemented and the updated data is attached.

- 6. Please provide an update on communication between the SROs and Principals and school security staff.**

The SROs continue to work in conjunction with the principals and security staff to keep the lines of communication open. All parties are communicating about how best to handle incidents in a manner that is most advantageous to the students and the safety of the school community.

The principals have been asked to continue to include the SROs in their weekly meetings, which reinforces that the SRO is a member of the team.

MCP Command, the State's Attorney's Office, representatives of the Principals' Bargaining Unit, and MCPS Officials continue to meet and discuss on-going training opportunities, the new sex assault notification process, and other matters of mutual interest.

2. Please provide the FY16 recommended appropriation for the SROs (and the one Sheriff, if still applicable). *Sheriff's Deputy \$111,872*
3. Please provide a brief update on any specific improvements, challenges, adjustments to operational practices that you've experienced this year.

*Deputy Sheriff Cynthia Defriece is the Sheriff's Office School Resource Officer for Col. Zadok A. Magruder High School in Rockville. She has been assigned to this high school since August 2013.*

*Deputy Defriece continues to find ways to work within the operational practices of the high school. She has found that focusing on educating and mentoring to be more beneficial than the standard enforcement approach. She actively seeks out relevant training over and above a deputy's standard training and the required SRO training. She recently attended 40 hours of CIT (Crisis Intervention Training) to heighten her awareness to students who may be in crisis. She brings a unique perspective as she is more familiar with Protection Orders and Peace Orders because of her experience with the Sheriff's Office.*

*Deputy Defriece has participated in training and presentations about law enforcement and other topics that relate to developing safe practices for students and staff, and assists with school events such as proms and sporting events. She has participated in the Brave and Bold program – a program unique to Magruder H.S. - that was formed by the school, parents and community to increase awareness of underage substance abuse.*

4. What is the expectation for SRO involvement with middle schools?  
*Deputy Defriece currently maintains a good line of communication with the two feeder middle schools, (Redland and Shady Grove) and intervenes in smaller issues to help them from becoming larger issues.*
5. When the Joint Committee was updated last October, you mentioned that the encounter data you provided was for the entire school, and not just what the SRO was involved with. At that time MCPD stated that going forward SRO data would be tracked separately to give a more detailed picture of SRO encounter data and experience. Has this separate data tracking been implemented? If so, please provide the most recent SRO encounter data by school (the number and types of calls, incidents, arrests). For the current school year if possible. If it hasn't been implemented, please provide the same data by school.  
*As requested by MCPD, Deputy Defriece provides end of month reports for data tracking to the 6<sup>th</sup> District supervisor.*
6. Please provide an update on communication between the SROs and Principals and school security staff.

*During her second year, Deputy Defriece has found her relationship with the Principal, educator staff and security to be very positive, and works closely with them on a daily basis. Deputy Defriece's SRO office is co-located with the school security staff. In addition to her issued "police radio", she carries an additional portable radio that allows direct*

*communication to the Magruder High School administrative staff and security personnel. She has also been issued a "smart" phone by the sheriff's office and a "tablet" by the school to ensure that she can maintain open communication with all the stakeholders.*
