2016 Elections

On April 26, 2016, BOE will conduct the 2016 Primary Election. The 2016 General Election will take place on November 8 (see ©1 for an election calendar with selected important dates). Ms. Jurgenson has provided a written update for Committee members at ©2-7. **Committee members may wish to receive a report on the November, 2015 municipal elections** (where the new voting equipment was used) **and an update on the preparation for April's Primary Election.** In particular, Committee members may wish to receive information on the following topics:

- *Wait times.* The *Bethesda Beat* article on ©8-9 notes the Board's concern regarding potential long wait times. Long lines has long been a concern to the Board and the Council; Committee members may wish to receive an update on this issue.
- *Voting methods.* The Maryland State Board of Elections recently voted to forgo the touch-screen voting machines that were to be used during early voting because the voting

machines could not display all candidate on the same screen. Instead, voters will be using paper ballots (see *Washington Post* article on ©10-12).

Voter Outreach

Public outreach has been an important concern to the Committee for a number of years. During the FY16 budget deliberations, the Council added \$50,000 to the Board's budget for outreach/advertising to explain the new voting equipment and encourage voter participation. During the FY16 Savings Plan, the Executive had recommended eliminating this money, but the Council restored the funding. This funding was especially important in light of the Board of Public Works' refusal to give the State Board of Elections \$1.8 million for an outreach program (see *Maryland Reporter* article at ©13-16). **Committee members may wish to discuss with the Board its outreach efforts and how these funds (as well as other outreach funds) are being utilized, especially in light of the recent events regarding voting methods.** For the Committee's reference, the County Board's Communication Strategy and Outreach Plan for the 2016 Presidential Election is on ©17-51 and an Outreach Calendar is on ©52-62.

Follow up on Early Voting Site Selection Process

As Committee members will recall, the following sites were selected by the County Board of Elections, and approved by the Maryland Board of Elections, for early voting locations for the 2016 Elections:

- Activity Center at Bohrer Park (Gaithersburg)
- Damascus Community Recreation Center (Damascus)
- Executive Office Building (Rockville)
- Germantown Community Center (Germantown)
- Jane E. Lawton Community Recreation Center (Chevy Chase)
- Marilyn J. Praisner Community Recreation Center (Burtonsville)
- Mid-County Community Recreation Center (Silver Spring)
- Silver Spring Civic Building (Silver Spring)
- Wheaton Volunteer Rescue Squad (Wheaton)

These sites were selected after the County Board's initial sites (excluding the Lawton Center and Praisner Center and including the Longwood and Potomac Community Recreation Centers) were not approved by the State Board of Elections.¹

As Committee members know, State law requires counties with more than 450,000 registered voters to have 8 early voting locations, with an option for a 9th early voting center if the State Board, in collaboration with the local board, and the County's governing body agree to establish the additional center. The County Delegation introduced House Bill 204, which would require

the County to have 10 early voting locations (and retain the option for an 11th site) (©63-65). As amended by the House Ways and Means Committee, one of the 10 locations would be required to be the Potomac Community Recreation Center. As amended, the legislation would specifically apply to the 2016 elections and would terminate at the end of the calendar year. House Bill 204 was adopted by the House and is currently in the Senate.

The Committee discussed the early voting site locations, including the selection process, at a meeting on October 1, 2015. Council staff's cover memorandum for that meeting is on ©66-68 and provides additional background material. The Committee Chair requested follow-up information on the site selection process, including information on how locations are selected as potential sites. Board members and staff will be prepared to discuss this issue at the worksession.

Voter Registration

As of February 1, there are 633,188 active registered voters in Montgomery County. Including voters whose record is designated as inactive because we believe their address to be out of date, we currently have 687,390 registered voters.

The last day to register to vote or change your political party in time for the primary election is April 5 by 9:00 p.m. While there has been much attention to the fact that Maryland is implementing same day registration for the first time during early voting this year, I want to emphasize that same day registration during early voting is only for new voters and for changes of address. Voters may not change their political party after April 5. This is important because more than a quarter of Montgomery County voters are not affiliated with a major political party, and we know from experience that many of these voters will be upset when they get to the polls on Election Day and do not have the opportunity to vote for candidates who are running for partisan office. If anyone wants to change their voter registration to vote for the candidates in a political party, they must do so by April 5.

New voters, and voters who have forgotten to update their address, will have a last chance during early voting to register or change their address during early voting from April 14 to April 21. To avoid casting a provisional ballot, voters who choose to wait until then will need to bring a Maryland driver's license or MVA ID with their current address.

Last fall, the Board of Elections finalized some changes to precinct boundaries and polling places for the primary election. The necessary steps to implement these changes, including a GIS interface with the statewide voter registration database, have now been completed and notifications sent to the voters whose precinct or polling place has changed. Changes to polling places usually occur because the precinct has outgrown the location, because the facility no longer meets the needs of the community, or due to building renovations. For example, for this election the Board decided to split the precinct that was voting at Field Roads Elementary School because it had grown to more than 5,000 voters. A new polling place has been established at the Retreat Community Center at Crown West. Every affected voter gets two mailings notifying them of their new polling place, a postcard and their sample ballot, and signage will also be placed at the old location directing voters to the new polling place.

On December 31, the State of Maryland migrated its voter registration database from an Oracle platform to SQL server. As with any significant change with a database, we are still working through some issues but overall it has been a smooth transition.

Approximately 15 percent of our new voter registrations are coming in through the state's online voter registration website, nearly double what we were seeing two years ago and significantly more than we receive on a paper form. Of course, the vast majority of our new voter registrations continue to come in through the Motor Vehicle Administration. We are now receiving reports from the multistate Electronic Registration Information Center, or ERIC, every two months from the other 14 states and the District of Columbia that share voter registration information through the ERIC project and it is making a difference in the quality of voter records. We do not remove anyone from the voter rolls automatically just because they show up in another state, but we do reach out to voters who appear on that report to confirm their residence address.

Voting Equipment

The Board has received the much of the equipment needed for the election. At this time the Montgomery County Board of Elections has received:

Another 1,283 voting booths are in route via ocean freight with delivery later this month.

The voting equipment has had the required acceptance testing performed and logic and accuracy testing has been completed in accordance to State of Maryland regulations.

Staff continues to test the equipment for quality control, including doing such things as testing the legs on the voting booths, to ensure that all equipment meets the performance standards for the State of Maryland.

We are also doing repeated rounds of testing on the software on the electronic pollbook for the 2016 elections. We were the first jurisdiction that needed to proceed with our Election Judge training before that software was finalized, so we are currently using a version of the Rockville ballot and pollbook database for training and are waiting to receive an updated version of the software to begin our training for early voting, particularly for the same day registration that will occur at early voting.

Additionally the State Board is working with the vendor to develop a means to provide the local boards of elections a method to transmit election results in an efficient but secure method. The state has determined that use of the wireless modems we were hoping to use is not consistent with the terms of their RFP, so this week we are doing testing at several recreation centers and libraries across the county with the goal of using the county's FiberNet system to communicate unofficial results on election night to avoid Election Judges having to drive all of the results up to our office in Gaithersburg before we can report even preliminary results to the media.

Candidate Filing

The candidate filing deadline was February 3.
March 2 is the deadline for the state to certify the ballot for the
Primary election on April 26.

Related to the number of candidates filing for the ballot, we have an
issue with ballot layout and design. The State Board of Elections
decided on Thursday, February 5, that due to the limitations of the
ballot marking device for the Primary paper ballots marked with black
ink pens will be deployed to all early voting sites. I have attached a
news article on this decision. The ballot marking device will still be
available for voters with disabilities to use to mark their ballot.

Ballots and Sample Ballots

Ballots will begin to be mailed on March 12 to overseas and military
voters. Voting will be available at the Board of Elections office
beginning on March 14.

Voters may vote by mail, during early voting, at the office of the Board
of Elections, or may choose to wait until Election Day to cast their
ballot.

Our sample ballot publication will also be mailed to all registered
voters and will include information related to the new voting system,
early voting locations, same day voter registration at early voting, and
voting by mail as well as providing each voter with their personalized
ballot for their political party and Congressional district and
information on their polling place.

If you are having conversations with your colleagues in the Maryland
General Assembly, we encourage you to ask them to move as quickly
as possible on the pending bill to authorize the tenth early voting site
in Montgomery County so that we can include updated information in
our sample ballot publication as it goes to print.

Outreach

Our staff is putting the additional funds that the Council provided for
this fiscal year to good use in demonstrating the new voting system at
numerous outreach events. We have hired seven part-time people who
are working on evenings and weekends as Ambassadors at outreach

events and I have attached a listing of the numerous events that they have attended to educate voters about the new voting system. The response by the public is generally positive. Many are surprised by the use of paper but overall seem pleased with the new system.

I also want to mention our High School registration program, which we have been conducting for many years in partnership with Montgomery County Public Schools. This year they have made several changes in their program, including shifting their voter registration drives to occur earlier in the year so that students can be registered to vote in time for the primary election. Those drives were conducted in December and January and we look forward to continuing to work in partnership with the school system on both voter registration and the Future Vote program to engage students to participate in democracy by working at the polls at early voting and on Election Day. Our Future Vote Program, first implemented in 2004 and that has grown since then, is an important part of our work to increase current and future voter knowledge, educate voters and strengthen civic participation. More than 1,000 Montgomery County students in grades 6-12 have already signed up to serve in the upcoming Primary Election.

Election Judges

There is always a need for Election Judges. We are in need of Republican Election Judges, in particular, especially in the areas of Potomac, Darnestown, Poolesville as well as countywide. The Board is also always looking for bilingual elections judges that speak Spanish and we also target precincts with a high concentration of speakers of other languages to send Election Judges who speak Chinese, Korean, French and other languages. Students may participate as young as 17 years of age at the polls in a paid position or if they are younger, they can earn Student Community Service Learning Units towards graduation. The Board staff has made a strong effort to include students at the polling places in the 2016 elections.

We began training on January 15, and as of this past weekend had trained 586 Election Judges and have another 752 scheduled for training. We have 1,799 voters who have not only signed up to serve as an Election Judge but have taken their online screening quiz that is required before they can sign up for training. We have shifted our temporary staff resources to focus even more heavily than in the past on recruitment, to make sure that we have an adequate number of

dedicated and well-trained Election Judges at all of our early voting sites and polling places for implementing the new system.

Early Voting

The Board has completed the submission of all documents to the State Board of Elections for all early voting sites. The coordination with the other county departments and sections within the departments and the vendors is proceeding in a positive manner.

The Board has finalized its Memorandum of Understanding with the Wheaton Volunteer Fire Rescue Association and are waiting for final signed documents from the City of Gaithersburg & from the county government. And as I mentioned previously, we are looking forward anxiously to receiving word on the legislation to expand early voting to the tenth site so that we can give proper notice of the list of early voting sites to the voters.

Looking Ahead to the General Election

Looking ahead to the general election, we know that we will learn many things from our first use of the voting system in the primary election and will continue to make improvements to our processes for the general election. We also know that we can expect long lines in a presidential general election, and I want to emphasize how important it is that we receive more voting equipment for the general election. Right now, we have one digital ballot scanner per polling place, which will cause a significant bottleneck at polling places with a large number of voters. Funding from the State of Maryland for their share of the additional equipment is a legislative priority for Montgomery County and we will need that additional equipment to avoid long lines at the polls in the general election.


Overall, implementation of the new voting system and preparations for the presidential election are going well. We look forward to answering any questions that you have.

Montgomery County Election Officials Worried New Voting System May Cause Long Waits

County will back state legislation to provide more voting equipment for 2016 general election

Montgomery County election officials are worried the state's new voting system and high voter turnout could spell long waits during the 2016 general election less than a year away.

Margaret Jurgensen, the county's election director, told Bethesda Beat the county's Board of Elections has on multiple occasions over the past year asked the state to help lease more voting equipment that could help shorten wait times.

Montgomery County has announced one of its priorities for the 2016 legislative session is to pursue about \$425,000 in state funding to match the county's funding commitment for leasing additional equipment.

Of foremost concern, according to Jurgensen, are the new DS200 digital image scanners. When the state moves to a paper-based voting system for the 2016 primary and general elections, voters on election day will fill out paper ballots.

Voters will then take those ballots to the DS200 scanners, insert the ballots and confirm the ballot is complete on a touchscreen.

But the state's initial equipment allocation leaves many of the county's 233 precincts with just one DS200 scanner, which

could lead to voters having to wait until the machine is available to scan their ballots.

"That will work if you have voter turnout of less than 50 percent," Jurgensen said. "There would be some lines. But if you're having 80 percent voter turnout, you have to have more equipment."

Jurgensen said county elections officials are expecting between 70 percent and 80 percent voter turnout at many precincts for the November 2016 election because of the presidential race, and races for seats in the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives.

The county did receive enough DS200 scanners to put two of the machines at precincts with more than 4,000 registered voters. Jurgensen said most precincts serve about 3,300 registered voters.

The county Board of Elections would also like more ExpressVote machines. Those touchscreen ballot machines will be used for early voting before the primary and general elections. Jurgensen said the county would like at least 25 ExpressVote machines at each of the nine or 10 early voting locations.

The county is supporting a bill from Del. Eric Luedtke and state Sen. Rich Madaleno that would add a 10th early voting location in Potomac, the solution agreed to by the county Board of Elections last month after a controversy over the relocation of early voting centers.

Md. ditches early-voting machines that don't display all candidates' names

The Maryland State Board of Elections on Thursday unanimously ordered early voting sites in the April primary to use paper ballots instead of touch-screen machines, which officials recently found makes it confusing for voters to navigate long lists of candidates.

The overhaul addresses a problem that might have siphoned votes away from candidates whose last names are farther down in the alphabet, such as presidential hopeful Donald Trump (R) and Senate candidate Chris Van Hollen (D). Several candidates' campaigns, which election officials declined to name, threatened possible legal action.

"The fairest, most viable and reasonable solution is paper ballots," said Patrick J. Hogan (D), the vice chairman of the State Board of Elections. "We want to maintain the integrity and fairness of the election, and that's really the only option."

The shift, which the five-member board approved at an emergency meeting, means that early voting sites will use the same paper-and-pen ballots, fed through a scanner, that will debut statewide in the April 26 primary. But unlike local precincts on Election Day, early voting sites must prepare as many as 50 different ballots to accommodate voters from various jurisdictions casting ballots in other races.

Election officials decided to use touch-screen machines that are already available for voters with disabilities to prevent a deluge of different paper ballots at Maryland's 66 early voting sites. But they didn't anticipate the system's failure to properly navigate voters through more than seven candidates.

That leaves candidates and lawmakers puzzling over the same question: Why is it so hard to put a bunch of names on a screen?

Kathy Rogers, an executive with Executive Systems and Software, the voting-machine vendor, said future versions of the equipment can display more candidates on a screen but the technology provided to Maryland is not flawed.

"You can absolutely move back to see the candidates," said Rogers, adding that Maryland is apparently worried that voters would hit the wrong button rather than having no way to navigate through the candidate lists.

State officials have known since November that touch screen-machines couldn't display all candidates' names. They changed machine settings to force voters to view all candidates after a pilot election in Rockville revealed the problem.

But voters who wanted to browse the second page of candidates couldn't return to the first page.

The issue was caught last month when Maryland's elections chief tried the system after a complaint from Anne Arundel judicial candidate Cathy Vitale.

"We didn't realize how unintuitive the navigation tools were," Elections Administrator Linda H. Lamone told state senators at a hearing earlier Thursday. "I sat down with the voting unit and tried to see my way through it . . . and I got lost."

Lamone said that local jurisdictions should be able to print enough ballots and train election judges in time, but there will be thousands of dollars in additional costs.

State Sen. Cheryl C. Kagan (D-Montgomery) said the problems in Rockville should have prompted state officials to change the voting machines' programming to display all candidates while they had time to get federal clearance for the machines.

"It's perplexing to me why they waited three months to seek to address it," Kagan said.

Lamone didn't warn state lawmakers during a Friday briefing where a lawmaker found similar troubles navigating candidate lists.

Lamone's deputy, Nikki Charlson, said it would have been inappropriate to broadcast the problems with the machine while officials were trying to find a solution.

At the board hearing, Hogan said the state should try to recover funds from the voting-machine vendor. But he and Lamone did not recall the limit on candidates emerging as an issue when securing the \$28 million contract for a new voting system.

"Do I wish I could go back? Sure, but you have to deal with things as they come at you," said Hogan, who is not related to Gov. Larry Hogan (R).

Del. Kathy Szeliga (R-Baltimore), a candidate for the U.S. Senate, said she is used to the challenges of being among the last on a ballot but was surprised that Maryland hadn't addressed the issue of candidates appearing on multiple pages earlier.

"You would think somebody would have thought of it," said Szeliga, who will appear as the 12th candidate in a 14-person Republican field to succeed retiring Sen. Barbara a. Mikulski (D-Md.).

Carl Stokes, a Baltimore City Council member and one of 13 Democrats running for mayor, said the early-voting problem adds to a pile of concerns about shifting to a new voting system.


"There's just too much confusion to the voters," Stokes said. "I wish they'd scrap the whole thing, frankly."

Lt. governor scolds bureaucrats on spending for land, budget cushions

Lt. Gov. Boyd Rutherford came down hard on state department spending this Tuesday, as he covered for Gov. Larry Hogan at the first Board of Public Works meeting since the governor announced he was starting treatment for cancer.

“It’s great to know everyone is not as cheap as I am, or as my mother would say, frugal,” said Rutherford. “I was one of those few government people who always felt I should spend less than the budget.”

Rutherford lectured the Department of Natural Resources about its high land bids, the Department of Juvenile Services and the Department of Human Services for unnecessary budget “cushioning” in the millions, and shot down the Board of Elections’ request for \$1.8 million for an informational ballot-campaign.


Rutherford will be taking on added responsibility following [an announcement by Hogan that he is starting an 18-week aggressive treatment plan for lymphoma](http://marylandreporter.com/2015/06/22/hogan-battles-the-big-c-more-formidable-than-the-big-ds/) (<http://marylandreporter.com/2015/06/22/hogan-battles-the-big-c-more-formidable-than-the-big-ds/>).

Rutherford, who was secretary of the Department of General Services in the Ehrlich administration, is no stranger to BPW meetings.

"I have concerns about the Department of Natural Resources in terms of their open space program because the whole idea of procurement is to have an arms length relationship," Rutherford said, addressing two Program Open Space items on the agenda. "In most cases we are buying at the top range of appraisals."

The two items on the agenda contained land parcels in Washington and Garrett counties. Maryland law requires DNR to conduct two appraisals when acquiring land. On both of the land bids, the amount bid was closest to the highest appraisal.

Need for objective procurement



<http://2qtvz46wicg34jx1h1blgd2.wpengine.netdna-cdn.com/wp-content/blogs.dir/67/files/2015/06/BPW-Emily-wilson-e1435114732426.jpg> Rutherford stressed the need for an objective procurement officer, someone able to distance himself or herself from "the passion of the purchase."

"DNR is in the business of conserving land. All land looks great to you guys," said Rutherford, arguing DNR doesn't have an officer walking into a bid saying "I'll pay this and not a penny more."

However, DNR Director of Land Acquisition and Planning, Emily Wilson, defended DNR, stating they have been saving about \$12.5 million through voluntary discounts.

Voluntary discounts are obtained when landowners favor DNR buying their land for preservation over the private sector buying land for development.

While conceding they do not always bid the lowest, Wilson pointed out that land goes through an evaluation process.

"Any property you see come before this body, has already gone through a rigorous review process," said Wilson.

The process involves looking for red flags on the property, the impact of possible climate change, scoring it to an ecological assessment and analyzing where it is in relation to existing DNR lands.

"I guess I still feel there is not an objective look at it," said Rutherford.

The lieutenant governor concluded the policy issue is one that will be addressed through possible, future legislation.

Cushioning budgets

Also under Rutherford's scrutiny was the request for "cushioning" funds, from both the Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) and the Department of Human Resources.

DJS wished to spend \$296 million to provide juvenile detention services through 32 different contractors, over multiple year contracts. Serving approximately 860 children in their facilities, that sum equaled paying out \$346,000 per juvenile, while the state found that cost was over four times the amount actually needed.

The board decided to approve contracts for only one year, fiscal 2016, which is \$60 million – the estimated cost of \$52 million plus a cushion of \$8 million.

"They (legislators) added a cushion, up to \$60 million, but the money they appropriated for actual services was \$52 million," Franchot said.

Franchot questioned these large cushions.

"The reality is that we do contract for more capacity than we anticipate that we are going to need, so that we can have flexibility to meet all of the court orders at various levels of service," said DJS Secretary Sam Abed.

After a lengthy chastising by the comptroller and lieutenant governor, the board chose to award Juvenile with \$60 million from the general fund for a one-year term, with the assurance DJS will return to BPW in a week with re-negotiated contracts.

Board asks for shorter time periods between budget approvals

The Department of Human Resources, which oversees several foster care programs, was also under scrutiny for its budget request.

DHR requested \$380 million dollars, to be spread out among 38 Child Placement Agencies over a three-year term.

However, BPW found the amount DHR would need to operate for only one year, specifically 2016, to be \$88.3 million.

DHR Deputy Secretary for Operations Greg James said they cannot predict how many kids they will serve each year.

However, Comptroller Peter Franchot and Rutherford were not deterred.

“Now you’re asking for 30% more than what you have been asking for, an 30% seems high to me,” said Rutherford.

Rutherford motioned for DHR to return to next board meeting with a recommendation that limits the three-year contract terms to FY 2016 only.

“It symbolizes that we are running a tight ship,” said Franchot. “I think what you do is very important, I just want to tighten it up fiscally.”

Awareness program on new voting machines

Last on the chopping block was the State Board of Elections, which proposed spending \$1.8 million on an outreach program to provide awareness of new voting machines, to be used for the first time in 2016.

“We just don’t want voters to be surprised when they arrive at their polling place,” said Sarah Hilton on behalf of the State Board of Elections.

“I guess I just think people are smart,” countered Rutherford, who argued voters were capable of understanding the new machines.

BPW voted the campaign was unnecessary and the \$1.8 million was denied.

Background

On September 21, the County Board of Elections announced that the early voting sites for the 2016 election cycle would be the following (©1):

- Activity Center at Bohrer Park (Gaithersburg)
- Damascus Community Recreation Center (Damascus)
- Executive Office Building (Rockville)
- Germantown Community Center (Germantown)
- *Longwood Community Recreation Center (Brookeville)*
- Mid-County Community Recreation Center (Silver Spring)
- *Potomac Community Recreation Center (Potomac)*
- Silver Spring Civic Building (Silver Spring)
- Wheaton Volunteer Rescue Squad (Wheaton)

Of these 9 early voting sites, Longwood Community Recreation Center and Potomac Community Recreation Center (italicized in the above list) are new early voting sites. The following 2 sites, which were used during the 2014 election cycle were not selected to be early voting sites: Marilyn J. Praisner Community Center (Burtonsville) and Jane E. Lawton Community Recreation Center (Chevy Chase). All Councilmembers and many others, including Congressman Chris Van Hollen have expressed concerns about the change in these 2 voting sites (see press releases beginning on ©24-31; see also newspaper articles on ©32-36). It is particularly puzzling that the Praisner Center was not chosen because as Councilmembers know, it was the second most utilized early voting site in the 2014 General Election (see early voting turnout chart on ©2).

Discussion

Maryland regulations include several criteria for early voting centers (see ©8). These include whether the site:

- will allow the local board to install the required telecommunication needs;
- is of sufficient size and layout to conduct early voting;
- is accessible or can be made accessible for voters with disabilities;
- is located in the County such that 80% of the registered voters live within 5 miles of an early voting center;
- has the ability to store equipment and supplies in a secure location;
- can accommodate long lines of voters, including protecting voters against inclement weather;
- is served by public transportation and roads;¹
- has sufficient heating and air conditioning;
- has sufficient parking facilities; and
- can accommodate a no electioneering zone.

A chart summarizing the proposed early voting centers and the whether these criteria are met for each proposed center is on ©3-4. Questions have been raised regarding whether the Longwood Community Recreation Center meets the criteria that an early voting center be “served by public transportation”. Council staff understands that the only bus that is near this Center is Ride On Route 53, which runs only in the morning and evening (see brochure on ©12-13). There is not a bus stop directly at the Center; the nearest stops are 0.2-0.3 miles from the Center. Further, according to the brochure, Route 53 runs only Monday through Friday. Early voting for the 2016 elections is Thursday, April 14 through Thursday, April 21 and Thursday, October 27 through Thursday, November 3.

Questions Committee members may wish to discuss with Board members include:

- What was the Board’s rationale for not choosing the Praisner Center or the Lawton Center as early voting sites? Did the Board consider that the Praisner Center was a high performing site during the 2014 elections before deciding not to include it as a site for the 2016 elections? Why move a high performing site? Why did the Board select the Potomac Community Recreation Center and the Longwood Community Recreation Center?
- Does the Board feel that the Potomac Community Recreation Center and the Longwood Community Recreation Center meet the criteria listed in Maryland Regulations? Do they have

adequate parking available? Even more specific, is the Longwood Community Recreation Center “served by public transportation” given its very limited access by bus and no access by rail?

Next Steps

The early voting sites proposed by the County Board of Elections must still be approved by the State Board of Election. The State Board is scheduled to discuss early voting sites at its October 15 meeting. **Committee members may wish to discuss whether the Committee – or Council – should send a letter to the State Board expressing its concerns about the removal of the Praisner and Lawton Centers as early voting sites.**

In addition to contacting the State Board, Committee members may wish to discuss whether the Council should request changes in State laws or regulations. Options that could be considered include:

- State legislation requiring that the Lawton and/or Praisner Centers be used for the 2016 elections. Committee members may wish to discuss with the Board whether, if the General Assembly enacted a law requiring these Centers be used, the Board could get the Centers operational before the primary in April since the General Assembly does not convene until January.
- Should state regulations require local Boards to take into account a site’s prior history as an early voting center when selecting sites?
- Should there be additional population criteria? Current regulations note 80% of the registered voters live within 5 miles of an early voting center. Should this be increased to 90%? A different number? Should 80% of the population live within 3 miles? A different number? As Councilmembers can see from the map on ©7, the 5 mile buffer geographically covers much of the County. However, using this criteria allows multiple centers in areas that are not very densely populated.
- Should State regulations more clearly define what is meant by “served by public transportation”?
