## The following items were identified for follow-up during the 5/8/2013 CountyStat meeting:

1. For next Pedestrian Safety Meeting, when displaying regional comparison data, incorporate a measure to rank or sort the counties and cities by population density to convey the difference between rural vs. urban areas, and/or rank by fatalities per 100,000 people.

2. The multi-agency effort addressing the issue of collisions in parking lots and garages will engage private property owners of lots and garages to be on a panel in order to address this issue through education, signage, or the possible redesign of parking facilities, and possibly partner with a local university to conduct a targeted study.

3. MCPD will be increasing their focus on driver violations ("Group 2") – Drivers at fault have been trending upwards in recent years – specifically in District-Identified Hot Spots through means such as education, enforcement, and pedestrian stings.

4. DOT is conducting photometric studies to improve lighting in specific areas in an effort to reduce collisions during evening and nighttime hours.
