**GREETING:** 

Good afternoon Mr. Compton, ladies and gentlemen. My name is Bruce Johnston and I am Chief of

the Division of Transportation Engineering for the Department of Transportation (DOT). The

purpose for this afternoon's public hearing is to present to you a proposal for the construction of a

sidewalk that will provide safer pedestrian travel along Stoneybrook Drive and Capitol View

Avenue. The project is located in the Kensington Planning Area within the Thirteenth Election

District of Montgomery County, Maryland.

The proposal is to construct a five foot wide pervious concrete sidewalk with associated roadside

grading and safety treatments. The sidewalk will be constructed on:

• The west side of Stoneybrook Drive from 10100 Stoneybrook Drive to Capitol View Avenue; and

The west side of Capitol View Avenue from Stoneybrook Drive to Lee Street

**PROJECT ELEMENTS** 

For your convenience, we have provided several displays that aid in the visual description of this

project.

**Display A:** is a project vicinity map showing the location for the proposed sidewalk relative to nearby pedestrian attractions, such as public transportation, churches and the existing network of sidewalks. The proposed sidewalk is shown in red. The total length of sidewalk construction is approximately 1,000 linear feet.

**Display B:** is two typical sections of the proposed sidewalk along Stoneybrook Drive. It shows the proposed curb and gutter, the proposed pervious sidewalk and the various grading options that will be utilized behind the proposed sidewalk. Stoneybrook Drive has a variable width public right-of-way and the existing roadway width is approximately 20 feet wide. There is sufficient public right-of-way along the residential properties on Stoneybrook Drive to facilitate sidewalk construction.

However, temporary easements to allow for driveway transitions will be required. DOT will have to obtain the necessary right-of-way on Maryland-National Capitol Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) property prior to constructing the proposed sidewalk adjacent to their property. **Display C:** is two typical sections of the proposed sidewalks along Capital View Avenue. It shows the proposed curb and gutter, the proposed pervious sidewalk and the various grading options that will be utilized behind the proposed sidewalk. Capitol View Avenue has approximately 30 feet of public right-of-way at this location and the existing roadway width is approximately 20 feet wide.

There is approximately 10 to 12 feet of available right-of-way dedicated for public use along the west side of Capitol View Avenue. Either permanent easements or right-of-way purchase will be required for

the construction of the proposed sidewalk and associated features.

The Department of Transportation evaluates requests for pedestrian facilities based on their ability to display a public use as well as their ability to enhance public safety. A sidewalk on Stoneybrook

Drive and Capitol View Avenue will create a connecting link to existing sidewalks, and enable safer access for pedestrians to nearby public facilities and public transportation. Capitol View Avenue has virtually no shoulder for pedestrians to walk on, and is very dangerous along this portion of the roadway.

A portion of the proposed sidewalk project is located within the Capitol View Park Historic District. DOT coordinated with the Maryland Historic Trust and M-NCPPC's Historic Preservation Office concerning impacts to that area. Project plans were provided to both organizations for review and approval. The removal of eleven (11) trees varying in size and caliber is anticipated on property owned by M-NCPPC. DOT is coordinating with M-NCPPC to create a tree plan for the removal and replanting of new trees.

In addition, a portion of the proposed project located on Capitol View Avenue is along MD 192.

Therefore project plans were also submitted to Maryland State Highway Administration (MSHA) for comments and approval.

## **COST AND ASSESSMENTS**

The estimated cost for this entire project is \$427,000. This includes project design, construction, inspection and administrative costs. Funding will be provided under the County's Annual Sidewalk Program, CIP Project No. 0506747.

There are no properties which are considered to be specially benefited by the proposed improvement.

Therefore, no properties are expected to be assessed.

We anticipate construction in spring 2015. The construction is expected to take approximately two to three months to complete.
