What does this mean?

- 65% of the fires are in SFD, TH, Quad that are residential
- We use interior attack on 68% of all fires we respond to

• Our bread and butter is:

House fires that we fight from the interior

Good Trends

- We are performing the basics well:
 - It was not very long ago that we had difficulty with the basics: Supply lines, attack lines, and ladders
- We don't have to spend a lot of energy correcting those tactical issues

Good Trends

- Only 5% of initial attack we chose the wrong strategy or tactic
- Only 8% of the time crew integrity is an issue on the fire ground
- 12% of the time apparatus placement is an issue
- 9% of the time ventilation is done at the wrong time

Bad Trends

- 18% of the time we have bidding issues
- 20% of the time we have on the scene report issues
- 20% of the time there are water supply issues
- <u>25% of the time running-order change</u>
- 15% of the time we have one or more units fail or respond understaffed

Where Do We Go?

- Keep going with thoughtful, honest afteraction reports
- All facets of the organization improve when we repeat what we did well and learn from our mistakes
- We are still an interior firefighting department
- We will continue to knock from the exterior when it helps
