ACCOMPLISHEMENTS CY2017

- Hired Community Educator Oscar Mendez
- Car Seat Program revamped increasing efficiency
- Still have over 1000 IECS volunteer providers
- Averaging over 115 new volunteers per quarter
- Averaging 130,000 hours of standby per quarter
- Averaging 3000 hours of in station drills/training per quarter
- Home Safety Inspection Program averages 500 visits per quarter, with over 700 smoke detectors



ACCOMPLISHEMENTS CY2017

- 270 Batteries replaced
- 120 Carbon Monoxide Detectors installed
- 24 Public Education Seminars Conducted
- Processed 1000 Volunteer Physicals
- Processed 460 Back Ground Checks/Fingerprinting
- Managed Command Competency Scheduling for all Volunteer CCO's
- LFRD's use of Amoss and EMST to improve stations and purchase apparatus



Where Can We Improve??

- Retention, accepted 460 new volunteers in CY17, but lost 320 existing volunteers for a net total of 140 new volunteers.
- Staff Additional units/increased staffing at several LFRDs
