



MCFRS PPE CLEANING AND REPAIR

Mark contaminated PPE on the outside of the bag and on the ticket!

PPE should be sealed in one or two plastic bags totaling 3 mils thickness. (Don't use red biohazard bags – some PPE has been thrown away)

Any biohazard or chemical hazmat should be identified on the outer most bag as well as on the Maryland Fire repair ticket. For any biohazard, add a red "Biohazard" sticker or caution tape on the outside of the bag.

Fill out the repair ticket for each item that is being cleaned:

- Personnel name and rank
- "MCFRS" and your station #
- Instructions such as "clean and repair"
- Any contamination description, such as bed bugs, COVID, blood, gasoline etc. (REPEAT the contamination description on the outside of the bag)
- Save your ticket number until your item is returned.

Maryland Fire doesn't pickup unless they have a drop off or they receive a phone call.

Call Maryland Fire by 8 am weekdays if you have a pickup and **tell them if you have contaminated gear**. You can leave a message 24/7.
