Service dogs are trained to aid individuals who are mobility impaired to achieve their desire to be independent by performing tasks that are physically demanding. Hearing dogs are trained to reliably alert people who are deaf or hard-of-hearing to all of the significant sounds in their environment. Dogs will spend approximately 2 to 3 years being socialized, learning basic obedience, and the specialized work they will perform. In-home Skilled Companion Dogs provide the same assistance as other service dogs do to individuals with disabilities, however these trained dogs do not have public access and only provide assistance in the home. Also train service and hearing dogs to meet the needs of military veterans.
