The Montgomery County Office of Human Rights (OHR) is accepting nominations for its Hall of Fame. Nominations should be individuals – either living or deceased – whose ongoing work, service and contributions have positively impacted human and civil rights in the County. The deadline for nominations is Sunday, Oct. 15.

This is the 11th year for this biennial event. The Human Rights Hall of Fame mission is to honor individuals who have made great personal sacrifices in contributing to human and civil rights in Montgomery County, either as trailblazers of the past or as current light bearers in the struggle. The honorees will be recognized for their visionary leadership, outstanding achievements and altruism on the road to eliminating discrimination and advancing human rights.

A select number of nominees will be recommended for induction into the Hall of Fame by a panel of Hall of Fame members who will act as the selection committee. The virtual induction ceremony is planned for Sunday, Dec. 6.

To nominate an individual for the Hall of Fame, submit a typed narrative, <u>not to exceed one page</u>, which documents your nominee's achievement(s), accomplishment(s) and contribution(s) to human and civil rights in Montgomery County.
