Maryland Updates Smoke Alarm Law

Important Information You Need to Know

- 1. Maryland's new smoke alarm law requires the replacement of all **BATTERY-ONLY** operated smoke alarms with units powered by sealed-in, 10-year long-life batteries.
- 2. All smoke alarms have expiration dates.

 Both hard-wired and battery-operated smoke alarms need to be replaced every ten years.

 If your smoke alarm has not been replaced since 2010, it's time!
- 3. Location, location, location smoke alarms are required to be located outside each sleeping area and on every level of your home including basements (finished or unfinished).
- 4. For homes constructed since July 1997, smoke alarms have been required inside all sleeping rooms. For maximum protection, fire officials recommend installing smoke alarms in sleeping rooms regardless of the year of construction.
- **5.** Any resident requiring information or assistance can call 3-1-1.
