

Our County Needs You! - Election Workers for the 2024 Presidential Primary and General Elections

Every two years, the Montgomery County Board of Elections conducts two elections that allow our registered voters to choose their elected representatives in local, State and/or Federal government.

Successful administration of elections requires a large number of employees and volunteers.

We are asking our County employees to serve as Election Workers during early voting (Thursday, May 2 to Thursday, May 9) and/or on Election Day (Tuesday, May 14) for the 2024 Presidential Primary Election.

To serve as an Election Worker, you must be a United States Citizen, a registered voter in Maryland, and you must pass an online guiz and attend an in-person training.

The Board also needs individuals with bilingual language skills and recruits for a balance of political party affiliations at each polling place.

A full day of service provides a minimum stipend of \$250 per day and an additional \$50 for in-person training. If you served as an election worker during early voting or on election day in prior elections, you are eligible to receive a \$100 bonus.

<u>Subject to supervisory approval</u>, County employees may choose to use annual or compensatory leave, a personal day, or administrative leave of up to a maximum of 8 hours to serve as an Election Worker.
