

We're prepared for storms. Are you?



Three things you need to do to get ready for seasonal storms and emergencies:

1 Sign up for Alert Montgomery

For emergency alerts that are sent directly to your cell phone or email address, sign up for Alert! Montgomery. It's easy. Just go to <https://alert.montgomerycountymd.gov> or text MONTGOMERY to 411 911 from your cell phone.

You will receive timely information about severe weather, major traffic disruptions, significant power outages and flooded areas. This service is free, and you can choose text, email or pager alerts. If you select notifications by text, be sure to check with your wireless plan to determine if text charges will apply.

Call 311 or go to www.mc311.com

311 is Montgomery County's easy-to-remember phone number for government information and services. The 311 Customer Service Center is routinely open weekdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. During weather emergencies and other significant incidents, service hours are extended so that callers can get answers to their questions and report service needs.


