The Montgomery County Department of Recreation is hosting a Summer Camp and Job Fair that is designed to showcase summer employment opportunities. The department hires more than 3,000 seasonal employees annually and they still need to fill almost 1,000 of those jobs for this coming summer.

Applicants are encouraged to bring their resumes to the job fair and prepare for speed interviews. The opportunities range from lifeguards to camp counselors to summer camp directors. The seasonal pay begins at \$11.50 an hour and increases based on experience and position.



Montgomery County Council's Committee Work Has Begun on the Capital Budget
Capital budget review for Montgomery County Public Libraries, Fire and Rescue Services, Wheaton redevelopment,
Montgomery Parks and other departments

This week, Council Committees began working on the County's capital budget. The Council held three public hearings on the capital budget and heard from 73 residents. The Council will take all testimony, emails and letters into consideration as they make decisions on the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Capital Budget and the FY19-24 Capital Improvements Program (CIP). The County Executive's recommended six-year CIP totals \$4.521 billion.

The Committee meetings will be televised live by County Cable Montgomery (CCM). The channel can be viewed on Cable Channels 996 (high definition) and 6 (standard definition) on Comcast; Channels 1056 (HD) and 6 (SD) on RCN; and Channel 30 on Verizon. ## Matching Mini Grants Still Available for Neighborhood Events & Projects!

The Neighborhood Events Matching Mini Grant Fund was established by Montgomery County to assist and encourage neighborhood organizations, clubs, tenant associations, etc. in their community capacity building and networking efforts, and to stimulate the local economy. The fund is administered by the five Regional Services Centers, and may be used to hold community/neighborhood events and activities. Some examples that have been funded include a neighborhood movie series, an afterschool homework club, a spring break camp, signage and landscaping for a neighborhood entrance, and others.

The maximum grant amount is \$1,000 per year per organization/group. Each grant must be matched dollar for dollar with cash or in-kind donations, and the event must take place by June 30, 2018.
