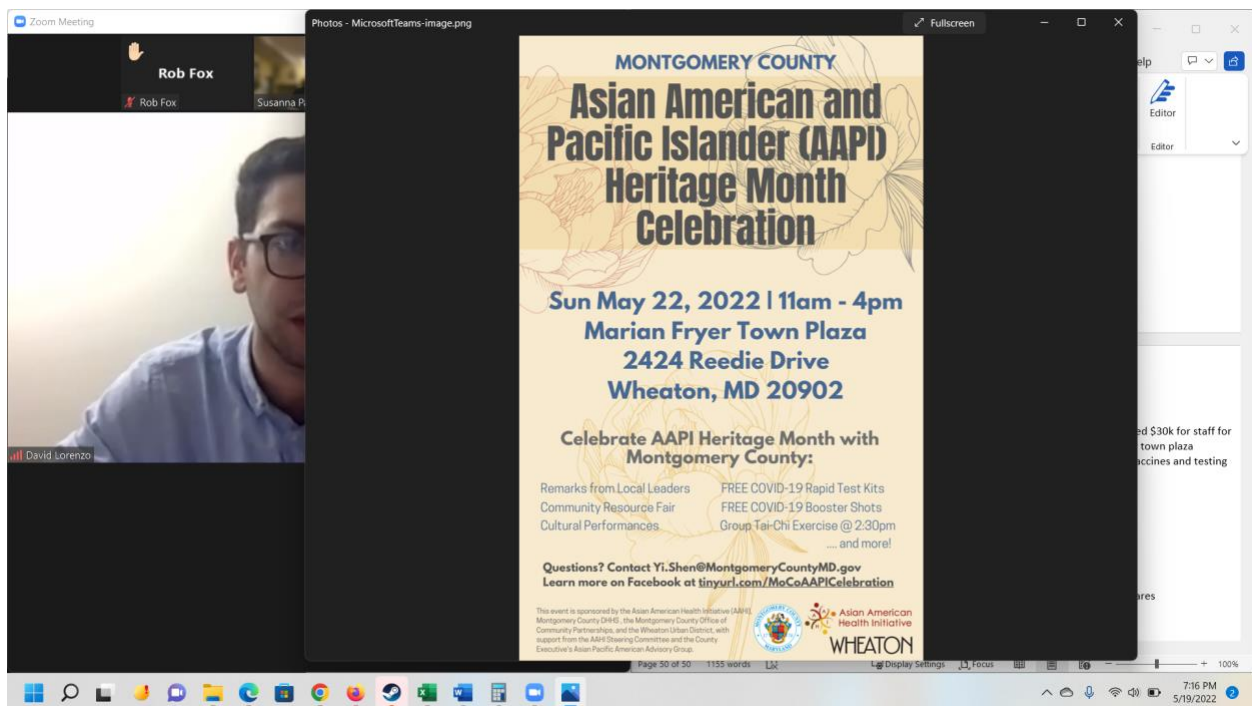


MCCAB 5.19.2022 Meeting

- County council approved 98% of the county president's budget, Navarro added \$30k for staff for the Wheaton arts district including staff for management of the Marian Fryer town plaza
- Will be celebrating AAPI heritage month at the plaza this month, giving out vaccines and testing kits – Sunday 5/22 from 10am-4pm
- Encouraging people to wear masks indoor places
- Nominate people and groups for chamber of commerce awards



County council report

- Passed the \$6.3b budget
- Councilmembers got through funds for Wheaton arts organizations
- Glass got through \$400k for MoCo PD cadet program
- Tried to get fare free ride on, but didn't happen – it will be at \$1 for ride on fares

- In 2022, there are new trends
- A lot of unreported robberies of small time weed dealers
- Small unorganized gangs targeting small-time weed dealers, and ghost guns are making this more dangerous, with robbing being the main goal, it's over small amounts of marijuana
- Running groups at Kennedy and Northwood, places where kids are getting into trouble and fights
- Have a circle with them, talk about life skills, know who they are in school to know who they are in the community

- If someone sees something (graffiti or gang activity) what can people do?
 - You can reach out to us and we'll connect you to the appropriate person for your neighborhood
 - Try to establish relationships with each side and come to a cease fire kind of thing, in upcounty there's been ongoing shootings for a few months
 - Several fightings at Glenmont metro station, and McDonalds is another popular hangout spot
 - Graffiti is trying to say something and make a point, so it means something
- Concerns about Kennedy students breaking into someone's house during the school day; also concerned about the graffiti at the Glenmont shopping center
 - Would love to connect on that, they will send a team there and they'll engage the youth that are hanging out
 - They have no-tryout soccer teams and other activities for getting kids involved with, and they'll learn life skills along with that
- Do you need more staff? How do you work with school systems to be hand in hand with them on this? Do you work with organizations like Identity?
 - They would love more employees, they are maxed out work wise. They are in over 16/17 schools right now, putting out fires. They have a lot of gang activities in the schools. Its about building those relationships. They are starting at the elementary level, softening it up a lot with elementary kids.
 - **Luisa Cardona:** more resources should be coming in the budget
- When it comes to social media, have you reached out to the youth or the companies who manage their content?
 - They have close ties to the gang unit who are doing their part, their investigations
 - Several of their staff come from people who were participants in the program

- Do you all offer counseling, drug awareness, mental health issues, and is the counseling individual or group? Also, was there other free programs or afterschool/weekend programs in the budget that went through?
 - The additional \$5m of funds from the council will enhance the program, all those services are for free, and with the funding they'll hire additional mental health therapist and wellness center
 - The additional 19 schools in addition to the 17 currently worked with will get wellness staff and a mental health professional, the plan is to continue to open these up but also provide this supplemental support, allowing them to fund non-profits to provide these services in communities without wellness centers

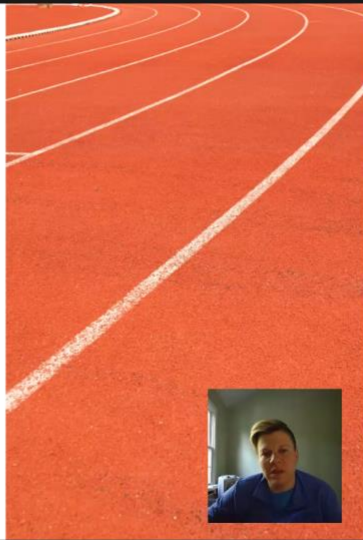

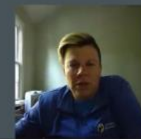

SUMMER LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE

Summer Leadership Challenge

- SLC helps develop leadership skills and gives teens an opportunity to practice independent problem-solving skills. The program includes a capstone project that participants coordinate and implement for the benefit of the local community. Participants earn up to 35 SSL hours and receive individual evaluations. Includes field trips.
- 2 Week Camp Sessions: 6/27/2022 to 7/8/2022; 7/11/2022 to 7/22/2022; 7/25/2022 to 8/5/2022; 8/8/2022 to 8/19/2022
- Times 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Ages 13-16

Summer Leadership Challenge – Lifeguarding

- Designed to introduce participants to what it takes to become a certified lifeguard. Participants must have basic swimming ability, be comfortable in deep water and submerging underwater. Instruction focuses on water skills needed for successful completion of the American Red Cross pre-course skills test for lifeguard training. Participants earn up to 35 SSL hours. Includes field trips.

Jared Solomon Legislative Update

On education committee

Looking at a structural budget surplus

The state was able to weather the pandemic well, due to educated workforce and making sure to help the hardest hit communities

State tax revenues shot through the roof

They really benefitted from the federal investments and COVID relief dollars

Put about \$2.5 billion into a rainy day fund

Put \$800 million aside for a blueprint for MD's future, investing in the public school systems

\$100m for childcare investments

\$100m for affordable rental housing

\$200m for providers serving vulnerable populations

Record amounts of funding for parks and recreation across the state

Expand and revitalize our parks system

MoCo got \$30 million for parks

\$300k for a skate park at Newport mills

\$3.2m for Wheaton regional park for the refresh, with the planning board hosting a meeting on the Wheaton regional park plan

Incredible levels of investment in transportation and transit, BRT plans for Route 29 and other routes

\$67m to really get BRT implemented, \$27m a year potentially for the next 30 years, as soon as the bonds are set, MoCo is the only county in the state looking to have a BRT to access the \$27m in bond funds

Funding for MARC improvements, run through service into VA and to Delaware

Strongest clean energy climate solutions bill – reduce GHGs by 60% by 2030 and achieve 0% by 2045

Zombie permits for clean water

Banned PFAS in the state

Train women's health providers to ensure access around the state, Medicaid and private insurance to provide abortion care, dental coverage as a part of medicare

Childcare community support to return to baseline, 5 bills on this; a revolving capital loan fund for new/renovate centers; childcare scholarship program improvements; paid family leave bill;

Bill to ban ghost guns

Can't interrogate a juvenile without a parent or a lawyer

Bill to start the marijuana legalization referendum process

Tax relief, on things like diapers, baby wipes, formula, medical supplies
