7:05 p.m.	Introductions Welcome New MCCAB Members Agenda Minutes	 Members and guests provided brief introductions Agenda for the December 2020 meeting was approved unanimously by the board. Minutes from the November 2020 meeting will be shared prior to the next meeting and approved in January.
7:15 p.m.	MC Fire & Rescue Update	 Chief Goldstein provided the new members of an overview of his engagement with the board. Each of the CABs have a division chief assigned to them. Leisure world fire – Elkridge court (11/28) is a 3 story apartment building. 50 residents in the building needed evacuation. There was one fatality (resident of the third floor apartment). No cause of the fire has been identified but the investigators believe the fire started in the attic. 120 firefighters on the scene COVID and impact on MC Fire & Rescue – saw a reduction in car related incidents.

Representation from all of the assistant chiefs (police), HHS, attorneys office, fire and ems. About 60 members were broken into 5 subcommittees
