7:10 p.m.	Guests	<ul> <li>Montgomery County Food Council (Heather Bruskin, Executive Director)</li> <li>MCFC workgroups are open to the public to join</li> <li>13 member food security community advisory board (started in 2018)</li> <li>Food Security Plan was launched in January '17 (was required to be developed by Bill 19-16 ('16)         <ul> <li>Many components of the Plan aided the county's response to COVID-19</li> </ul> </li> <li>30,000 children are food insecure</li> <li>Family of 4 needs \$91,250 bare minimum</li> <li>2020 projected food insecurity rate is 13%</li> <li>MCFC has developed a COVID-19 Food Assistance Referral Tool</li> <li>Montgomery county has the highest percentage of individuals who are eligible for SNAP but do not enroll</li> <li>MCPS schools will be able to participate in the summer meals program</li> <li>Question: How does the food council support local farmers?</li> <li>Over 200 agriculture producing farms in Montgomery County</li> <li>NAFRAC is bringing regional funds to local food producers and food assistance providers</li> <li>Getting farmers access to PPE</li> <li>Greatest issue for meat producing farms is accessing slaughter facilities</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Question: Can you discuss the Food Hub model? How is it different from "regular" food distributions?</li> <li>Consolidates all necessities currently needed by those adversely impacted by COVID-19 in a single, centralized place and then distributed to smaller organizations.</li> <li>MCPS got a farm to families grant</li> <li>Community organizations were requesting access to that food. MCPS is using school buses and drivers (alcohol beverage services used trucks to distribute food as well)</li> </ul>
