Responsible Practices to Work with Intoxicated Patrons and Under 21 Individuals

Suggestions for Responsible Hospitality

It is illegal to sell alcohol to intoxicated individuals, individuals known to be "habitual drinkers", the mentally deficient, those of unsound mind and minors under the age of 21.

- Refuse service to those who are intoxicated.
- Avoid promotions that encourage over consumption.
- Have a written policy listing step by step instructions on what a server should do if a patron becomes intoxicated.
- Train staff on responsible alcohol service policies.
- Publicize alcohol policies in visible locations.
- Monitor guests' consumption of alcohol beverages.

- Encourage food sales and nonalcoholic drinks. Place a glass of water down, without asking, to accompany the first alcoholic drink.
- Do not allow staff to consume alcohol while working.
- Encourage servers to ask for an ID whenever they are in doubt of a patron's age.
- Arrange alternative transportation and/or lodging for guests who may become alcohol impaired.
