AN AMENDMENT to the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance to:

- (1) create a Temporary Telecommunications Facility use;
- (2) create an approval process for Temporary Telecommunications Facilities; and
- (3) generally amend the provisions for telecommunications [[towers]] <u>facilities</u> and temporary commercial uses.

By amending the following sections of the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 59 of the Montgomery County Code:

Division 1.4. "Defined Terms"

Section 1.4.2. "Specific Terms and Phrases Defined"

Division 3.1. "Use Table" Section 3.1.6. "Use Table"

Division 3.5. "Commercial Uses"

Section 3.5.15. "Temporary Commercial Uses"

23		1. <u>Defined</u>
24		Temporary Telecommunications Facility means a monopole or portable
25		wireless communications facility used to provide wireless voice, data, or
26		<u>image</u> <u>transmission</u> <u>within</u> <u>a</u> <u>designated</u> <u>area.</u> <u>A</u> <u>Temporary</u>
27		Telecommunications Facility does not have permanent location on the
28		ground, including the pouring of a concrete footing or the laying of a
29		permanent foundation.
30		2. <u>Use Standards</u>
31		Where a Temporary Telecommunications Facility is allowed as a limited
32		use, it must satisfy the following standards:
33		<u>a.</u> <u>A Temporary Telecommunications Facility that is 80 feet or</u>
34		less in height, on wheels, and erected for less than 30 days is
35		not required to obtain a building permit.
36		b. For a Temporary Telecommunications Facility over 80 feet in
37		height or erected for 30 or more days, a building permit
38		application to DPS for the construction of a Temporary
39		Telecommunications Facility must include a recommendation
40		from the Transmission Facility Coordinating Group issued
41		within 60 days of the submission of the building permit
42		application.

43	<u>c.</u>	An a	pplication for a Temporary Telecommunications Facility
44		must	demonstrate that it is necessary for one of the following
45		reaso	<u>ns:</u>
46		<u>i.</u>	administering limited frequency and modulation testing
47			to evaluate system performance and the need for
48			additional wireless communications facility sites;
49		<u>ii.</u>	supplementing communications coverage when a
50			previously permitted wireless communications facility
51			has become involuntarily non-operational through an
52			accident or natural disaster;
53		<u>iii.</u>	a substantial increase in the communications needs of the
54			County due to an emergency declared by the County,
55			State, or federal government;
56		<u>iv.</u>	a substantial increase in the communications needs of the
57			businesses, residents, or visitors of the County for a
58			limited period of time due to a large conference or
59			special event held within the County;
60		<u>v.</u>	substantial maintenance undertaken or caused by the
61			County that requires maintaining uninterrupted wireless
62			<u>communication</u> <u>service</u> <u>with</u> <u>temporary</u> <u>wireless</u>
63			facilities;
64		<u>vi.</u>	a capital project undertaken or caused by the County that
65			requires maintaining uninterrupted wireless
66			<u>communication</u> <u>service</u> <u>with</u> <u>temporary</u> <u>wireless</u>
67			facilities;
68		<u>vii.</u>	relocation from a building owned by a bicounty agency
69			or a utility company, where the building the wireless

70		communications facility was located on is under repair or
71		renovation; or
72		viii. unforeseen circumstances that DPS determines require
73		temporary alternative wireless communication facilities
74		to maintain uninterrupted wireless communication
75		service.
76	<u>d.</u>	The initial approval of a Temporary Telecommunications
77		Facility is permitted for up to 180 days. DPS may approve
78		extensions if:
79		i. the requests are made in writing prior to the expiration of
80		the initial approval period or current extended approval
81		period;
82		ii. the extensions are reasonably necessary to resolve or
83		accommodate the reasons for the initial approval; and
84		iii. the total time approved for extensions, including the
85		initial 180 day period, does not exceed 2 years.
86	<u>e.</u>	A Temporary Telecommunications Facility must be removed,
87		at the cost of the owner, and the site restored to its previous
88		condition within 48 hours of the end of the approval period.
89	<u>f.</u>	Unless approved due to an emergency declared by the County,
90		State, or federal government, an application for a Temporary
91		Telecommunications Facility must include:
92		i. the subject property's ownership and, if the applicant is
93		not the owner, authorization by the owner to file the
94		application;

95		ii. a description of the proposed use and all associated
96		equipment, including structural design, proposed height,
97		color, location, fencing or screening, and setbacks;
98		iii. plans showing height and architectural design of the
99		Temporary Telecommunications Facility, including
100		color, materials, and any proposed landscaping and
101		<u>lighting;</u>
102		iv. a certified copy of the official zoning vicinity map
103		showing the area within at least 1,000 feet surrounding
104		the subject property;
105		v. plans showing existing buildings, structures, rights-of-
106		way, tree coverage, vegetation, historic resources, and the
107		location and design of streetlights, utilities, or parking lot
108		poles within 300 feet of the proposed location; and
109		vi. photograph simulations with a direct view of the
110		Temporary Telecommunications Facility from at least 3
111		directions.
112	<u>g.</u>	The maximum height for a Temporary Telecommunications
113		Facility is 200 feet.
114	<u>h.</u>	A Temporary Telecommunications Facility must not use an
115		electric, gas, or other type of generator that violates the
116		maximum allowable noise levels in Chapter 31B, Noise
117		Control.
118	<u>i.</u>	A Temporary Telecommunications Facility must not be
119		<u>illuminated</u> <u>unless</u> <u>otherwise</u> <u>required</u> <u>by</u> <u>the</u> <u>Federal</u>
120		<u>Communications</u> <u>Commission</u> <u>or the Federal Aviation</u>
121		Administration.

122	<u>j.</u>	A Temporary Telecommunications Facility must be at least 100
123		feet from any abutting property line. DPS may approve a
124		reduced setback if recommended by the Transmission Facility
125		Coordinating Group. The Transmission Facility Coordinating
126		Group may recommend a reduced setback if the location is
127		required for the function of the Temporary Telecommunications
128		Facility and no other reasonable alternative location exists.
129	<u>k.</u>	Unless approved due to an emergency declared by the County,
130		State, or federal government, an applicant for a building permit
131		for a Temporary Telecommunications Facility must notify by
132		mail the municipality where the proposed [[tower]] facility will
133		be located, as well as all property owners, homeowners
134		associations, civic associations, condominium associations, and
135		renter associations within 300 feet of the proposed [[tower]]
136		facility. Notice must include a description of the proposed use,
137		including height and setbacks, as well as the anticipated dates
138		of operation.
139	<u>1.</u>	If approved due to an emergency declared by the County, State,
140		or federal government, an applicant for a building permit for a
141		Temporary Telecommunications Facility must send notice
142		consistent with Section 3.5.15.C.2.k. no more than 14 days after
143		placement of the Temporary Telecommunications Facility,
144		where practicable.
