SUBJECT: Capital Budget Wrap-Up and CIP Reconciliation

Mr. Riemer noted that straw votes would be taken today.

Received a report from Dr. Orlin, Deputy Director, on the Council's decisions on the CIP, as contained in the analyst packet.

Approved the reconciliation of the FY19-24 CIP for Park and Planning bonds, impact taxes, recordation taxes, General Obligation bonds and PAYGO, and Current Revenue, as outlined in the staff packet. Ms. Floreen made the motion, which carried unanimously.

Later in the meeting, Dr. Orlin noted that there was one project that was inadvertently not included in the analyst packet, the KID Museum. During the May 10, 2018, worksession the Council tentatively approved funding for acquisition of a building, \$1 million for the design of its renovation, and \$4 million for construction of the renovation. This CIP Reconciliation does not include \$4 million for construction of the renovation. The project description form (PDF) will note that the County expects there will be a match in funds from private donations. Mr. Berliner made the motion in support of changes in the KID Museum project, which carried unanimously.
