Special Appropriation to the County Government's Fiscal Year 2021 Operating Budget, Early Care and Education (ECE) Non-Departmental Account, Montgomery Moving Forward - ECE Coordinating Entity Plan, \$75,000 (Source of Funds: General Fund Reserves) and Amendment to FY21 Operating Budget Resolution 19-472 Section G, FY21 Designation of Entities for NonCompetitive Contract Award Status: Nonprofit Montgomery

We are Montgomery Moving Forward (MMF) Leadership Group members and private-sector supporters of MMF's work in general, and this proposal in particular. - A public-private entity will be nimble, flexible, and independent which allows for greater innovation both during the pandemic recovery period and in the long-term.

We have invested in this work because we believe that MMF is uniquely positioned to ensure robust community engagement of both the public and private sectors. Since its outset, MMF's collective impact model prioritizes collaboration and partnership between the public and private sectors and has earned our confidence in their ability to do that.
