The COVID-19 public health crisis has been difficult to navigate. Our children may be paying the biggest price. It seems like there is more concern about allowing bars and gyms to be open than consistent childcare and schooling. Mandating child care capacity at 50% could have a negative effect on young children and working parents, without substantially impacting community transmission rates, which are not driven by child care centers. 50% capacity is too low.
