(1) **DISCUSSION** - State Legislative Program

Participating in the discussion were Ms. Wenger, Director, and Ms. Boucher, Office of Intergovernmental Relations (OIR); Mr. Lattner, County Attorney's Office; Chief Jones, Montgomery County Police Department (MCPD); and Ms. Wellons, Legislative Attorney.

Ms. Wellons provided a summary of MC14-21/HB433, Public Campaign Financing – Expansion, to expand public campaign financing for candidates for the offices of Clerk of the Circuit Court, Register of Wills, Sheriff, and State's Attorney. Mr. Reimer made a motion to take a position in support of MC14-21/HB433. Mr. Friedson made a motion, which was not objected to by the maker of the original motion, that language be added that the state appropriate funding. Unanimously supported MC14-21/HB433, as amended.

Ms. Wenger provided an update on the 2021 session of the Maryland General Assembly.

Ms. Boucher provided an overview of SB627, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights – Repeal and Procedures

for Discipline, as passed by the Senate. Key provisions include making the Chief more responsible and accountable for disciplinary decisions; ensuring uniformity throughout the State by preempting local laws and prohibiting collective bargaining regarding investigations, interrogations, and discipline; and ensuring significant civilian involvement in the hearing board process. Discussed preemption and how SB627 would impact **Expedited Bill 34-20**, Police – Disciplinary Procedures – Police Labor Relations – Duty to Bargain – Amendments, which is pending. Mr. Lattner agreed to follow-up and provide Councilmembers with information on how SB627 might impact Expedited Bill 34-20.

OIR agreed to provide a summary of changes to the latest House version of the police reform legislation when it is available, as well as a comparison chart of the House and Senate bills.

Received brief updates on SB71, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Body-Worn Cameras; SB74, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Employee Assistance Programs and Early Intervention Programs; SB178, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Personnel Records – Investigations of Law Enforcement Officers (Anton's Law); SB419, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Search Warrants; SB599, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Surplus Military Equipment; SB600, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Office of the State Prosecutor – Investigation and Prosecution of Deaths Caused by Police Officers; SB626, Maryland Police Accountability Act of 2021 – Law Enforcement Officers – Use of Force, Reporting, and Whistleblower Protections.
